AN ACT to authorize the closing and fale of a part of Capital Street in the City of Montreal; and for the dilpofal of the monies arising from the fale of the fame.

(22 March, 1817.)

P:eamble

HEREAS it is expedient to close up that part of Capital street, in the City of Montreal, lying and between St. Joseph ftreet and the ftreet or lane, commonly called.

led. St. Dizier's Lane; and to authorize the fale of the fame, and that the monies ariting from the fale thereof, may be appropriated in opening and improving other Streets, Lanes and Public Places in the laid City; be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and content of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an ACt paffed in the Paritament of Great-Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act oaffed an " the fourteenth year of His Majefty's Reign. intituled, " An AEt for making more " effectual provision for the Gavernment of the Province of Quebec in North-America;" " and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province;" and it is here by enacted by the authority of the fame, that from and after the paffing of this Act, it shall be lawful for any three Justices of the Peace for the District of Montreals refiding in the City of Montreal, one of whom fhall be of the Quorum, to cause that part of Capital Street aforefaid, lying and being between Saist Jofeph Street and the Street or Lane commonly called and known by the name of St. Dizer's Lane, to be cloled and fhut up, and to feil and dispose of the same at public sale or auction, in fuch lots or proportions as the faid Jultices shall deem most expedient. Provided aiways, that if from the local fituation and confined limits of the ground to be iols, the faid Juffices shall fee good reason to besieve that a higher price would be obtained by private bargain, or by a valuation of fuch ground being made by three, capable and difinterested, perfons upon oath, it shall be lawful for the faid Justices to appoint fuch perfons, and to administer such oath to them, and to proceed to the sale of the ground by either of fuch modes in preference to a public fale.

The Justices of the Peace of the district of Montreal residing in that city, may cause that part of Capital street, lying batween St. Joteph street and St. Dizier's Lone, to be closed and shut up, and to sell and disgoes of the same.

Moniesarising from the Sale, how to be disposed 95 II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the monies arifing from the fale of the lot or lots of ground into which the aforefaid part or portion of Capital Street fhail or may be divided, purfuant to the directions of this Act, fhall go into and make part of the Road Fund for the aforefaid City of Montreal, and fhall be applied for the opening and improvement of fuch Streets, Lanes and Public Places of the faid City of Montreal, in fuch manner as the aforefaid Juffices of the Diffrict, or any two of them, (one of whom fhall be of the Quorum) in a Special Seffion to be heid for the purpole, fhall deem moft expedient.
