THEREAS many of the lines and boundaries of Lands, and real estates in this Province, have been drawn and laid down from the magnetic courses, without any regard to the true meridian, which, from the perpetual change in the variation of the compals, may be the cause hereafter of numberless and vexatious fuits, and the ruin of many individuals: And whereas the establishing and erecting of a certain number of Meridian Stones, from aftronomical observations in various parts of the Province, will produce the most beneficial effects in regard to the faid lines and boundaries; Be it therefore enacted, by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Att " for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of ce Quebec in North America;" and to make further provision for the go-" vernment of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the au-" thority
