II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that for the purposes of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the government of this Province for the time being, to apply and pay out of any of the unappropriated monies which now are, or which hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province, for the time being, a sum of money not exceeding five hundred pounds, current money of this Province; the due application of which said sum of money shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.

C A P. XI.

An ACT to grant a certain sum of Money for the purpose of repairing the Common Gaol of the District of Quebec.

(1st. April, 1818.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to grant a sum of Money for certain repairs necessary to be made to the Common Gaol of the District of Quebec, may it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further provision for the government of the said Province:" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the government of this Province for the time being, by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand and seal, to advance out of any unappropriated monies which now are, or which hereafter may come into the hands

hands of the Receiver-General of this Province, for the time being, a sum of money not exceeding the sum of two hundred and ninety-five pounds, three shillings currency, for the purpose of repairing the Common Gaol of the District of Quebec.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the said sum of money herein-before granted, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and successors shall direct.

C A P. XII.

An ACT to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the thirty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for the division of the Province of Lower-Canada, for amending the Judicature thereof, and for repealing certain Laws therein-mentioned,*" and to provide more effectually for the administration of Justice in this Province."

(1st April, 1818.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for the division of the Province of Lower-Canada, for amending the Judicature thereof, and for repealing certain Laws therein-mentioned,*" it is enacted, that the Court of King's Bench for the District of Quebec, shall consist of Your Majesty's Chief Justice for the said Province, and three Puisné Justices; and that the Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal shall consist of your Majesty's Chief Justice of the said Court, and three Puisné Justices: And whereas there now exist in the said Courts proceedings wherein the said Chief Justices, or the said Puisné Justices may be incompetent to sit and adjudge in their respective Courts, by reason of sickness, and to execute the duties of their offices, whereby Your Majesty's subjects are put to great inconvenience and delay in the recovery of their just demands—Wherefore, we, Your Majesty's faithful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Council and Assembly of Lower-Canada, taking into consideration the Message in this behalf of His Excellency the Governor in Chief, to both Houses of the Provincial Parliament, humbly beseech Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts*" of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled,

"An
