come into the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province for the time being toapply, in addition to the sum appropriated by the Act last above-mentioned, for the Distriction Quebec, a further sum of money not exceeding the sum of five him. dred pounds, current money aforefaid, for the relief of infane persons, and for the support of Foundlings, within the district of Quebec; out of which said sup of five hundred pounds, the fum of two hundred and nine pounds, fifteen shillings currency, shall be applied and go to the payment and satisfaction of a debt incurred for the relief of infane persons, and for the support of foundlings in the District. of Quebec, by the Commissioners appointed therefore.

Application of Mis Majesty.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the due application the money to be accounted for to of the montes appropriated under and in virtue of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, his heirs and inccessors, shall direct.

CAP. XIV.

An ACT to amend an Act passed in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to provide temporary Houses of Correction in . the several Districts of this Province, and for other purposes."

(1st April, 1818.)

HEREAS an Act was passed in the sistiy-seventh year of His Majesty's reign. intituled, "An A? to provide temporary Houses of Correction in the several Districts of this Province," whereby it is provided, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, on person administering the government of this Province for the time being, to advance certain fums of money therein-mentioned to the Committees to be appointed under the faid Act: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that the payment of the said sums of money should be made annually to the Committees appointed in virtue of the laid Act, for the purposes contained in the faid Ac, be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the sourceenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intisituled

"tuled." An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province

so of Ouebec in North America," and to make further provision for the government of 46 the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the government of this Province for the time being, out of any unappropriated monies which now are, or shall be hereafter in the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province, to advance annually, during the continuance of this Act. to the Committees which may have been, or shall be appointed under and by virtue of the aforesaid Act of the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, to Superintend the Houses of Correction in the several Districts respectively, that is to say, a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds, current money of this Province, for the Diffrict Tor the district of Ouebec; a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds, current money of this Montreal, and Province for the Difference of this Montreal, and a sum not exceeding one hundred pounds fivers. like currency for the District of Three-Rivers, for the purpole of enabling the faid Committees, or either of them in their respective Diftricts, to hire, or otherwise provide a building fit and proper to serve for a temporary House of Correction: and allo such accommodation for the performance of labour as may be requisite: and also to provide a stock of materials for the employment of the persons who now are. or shall hereafter be confined in the said Houses of Correction, in the aforesaid Diltricts respectively, as well as for the purpose of allowing reasonable salaries to the Superintendant and Keepers thereof, in each of the faid Districts respectively.

A further sum may be granted, but not to exceed £100 per annum more than granted by this Act for the district of Montreal.

II. And whereas it has been ascertained, that in consequence of the increased population of the District of Montreal, and the great number of prisoners which it has frequently been found nect flary to commit to the House of Correction for the said District, the aforesaid sum of two hundred pounds per anuum, is insufficient for the support and maintenance of the laid House of Correction; be it therefore enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or the person administering the government of this Province for the time being, to advance out of any of the before-mentioned funds, such further sum for the purposes aforesaid, as on a reprefentation from the Committees for superintending the said House of Correction may be found necessary, and shall be approved of by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the government of this Province for the time being Provided always, that the tum hereby authorized to be so advanced for the purposes aforefaid, over and above the aforefaid annual fum of two hundred pounds; fliall not in any one year exceed the sum of one hundred pounds, current money of this Province.

ATHEREAS the late John Contad Marsteller, who died on the seventeenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight, did devise and bequeath by his last Will and Testament, certain real or immoveable estates, and the rest, residue and remainder of all and every his estates, property and effects, after payment of his debts and legacies, for the purpose of establishing in the City of Montreal, a House of Industry, which said real estates consist of two loss of ground, with two stone houses and other buildings thereon erected, situate in the main Afrect of St. Mary's suburbs, in the Parish of Montreal, in the District of Montreals. and whereas the establishment of such House of Industry cannot be effected without the aid and affistance of the Legislature, Be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain init tuled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His " Majesty's reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the go-" vernment of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further provision "for the government of the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authocomposition rity of the same, that from and after the pailing of this fact a Corporation and now of the Wardens Politic and Corporate, for carrying into full effect the said will of the said John of the House of Industry of the Conrad Marsteller, and for executing the feveral powers vested in them by this Act, city of Montreal.
