CAP. XXIII.

An Act to appropriate a certain Sum of Money to provide for the expense of laying out Lands for Reduced Officers and Men of the Embodied Militia, and others, who served during the late War.

(24th April, 1819.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

THEREAS by Message from His Grace the Governor in Chief, to both Houses of the Provincial Parliament in the present Session thereof, His Grace did recommend, that in order to carry into effect Your Majesty's Royal Instructions, to grant portions of the Waste Lands of the Crown to reduced Officers and Men who honorably served during the late War, and to set apart such lands for the Officers and Men of the Embodied Militia, discharged troops and others who may come under the spirit and meaning of Your Majesty's instructions, a fum not exceeding three thousand pounds, corrency, should be appropriated; Now therefore, We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Commons of Lower Canada in Provincial Parliament affembled, do befeech your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain er parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled. CAP. XXIV.

An Act to authorife George Le Pallieur to sell a certain Lot of Ground in his possession, entailed upon the Heirs of the late (harles Le Pallieur, situate on Saint Joseph Street, in the City of Montreal.

Preamble.
