

## C A P. XXIII.

An Act to appropriate a certain Sum of Money to provide for the expense of laying out Lands for Reduced Officers and Men of the Embodied Militia, and others, who served during the late War.

(24th April, 1819.)

## MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS by Message from His Grace the Governor in Chief, to both Houses of the Provincial Parliament in the present Session thereof, His Grace did recommend, that in order to carry into effect Your Majesty's Royal Instructions, to grant portions of the Waste Lands of the Crown to reduced Officers and Men who honorably served during the late War, and to set apart such lands for the Officers and Men of the Embodied Militia, discharged troops and others who may come under the spirit and meaning of Your Majesty's instructions, a sum not exceeding three thousand pounds, currency, should be appropriated; Now therefore, We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Commons of Lower Canada in Provincial Parliament assembled, do beseech your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America;" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that out of the unappropriated monies which now are or that may hereafter come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, a sum not exceeding the sum of three thousand pounds, current money of this Province, shall be appropriated and paid by a Warrant or Warrants, under the hand and seal of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, for the purpose of enabling the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, to carry into effect His Majesty's Royal instructions, to grant portions of the waste lands of the Crown to Officers and men of the Embodied Militia, and discharged troops, who honorably served during the late War, and such others as may come within the spirit and meaning of the said instructions.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority foresaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated in virtue of this act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall direct.

## C A P. XXIV.

An Act to authorise *George Le Pallieur* to sell a certain Lot of Ground in his possession, entailed upon the Heirs of the late *Charles Le Pallieur*, situate on Saint Joseph Street, in the City of Montreal.

(24th April, 1819.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS *George Le Pallieur* of the City of Montreal, Notary Public, by his Petition hath represented, that over and above the ground which he hath been authorized to dispose of to the Justices of the Peace for the District of Montreal, in virtue of an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the District of Montreal to lay out and open a New Street in the City of Montreal, upon a Lot of Ground in the possession of *George Le Pallieur*, and to obviate certain inconveniencies therein mentioned," there remains a small piece of ground between the said street called Saint Joseph and a lot of ground belonging to *Pierre Charles Dubois*, of one foot in breadth, fronting on the *Place d'Armes*, and increasing in width along the continuation of the said street to four feet in width at the depth of the said lot, being seventy-eight feet from the front line; which said ground, by the Will of the late *Charles Le Pallieur*, father of the said *George Le Pallieur*, he the said *George Le Pallieur*, by reason of an entail (*substitution*) contained in the said Will, cannot alienate or sell: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly, of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said *George Le Pallieur* shall be and he is hereby authorized to sell and dispose of the said lot of ground herein-before mentioned, and to make and execute to the purchaser or purchasers thereof a good and legal title to the same. Provided always, that he the said *George Le Pallieur* do conform to the clauses and conditions hereinafter-mentioned,
