TATHEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a Sum of Money for the purpose of establishing a stepping Mill in each of the Houses of Correction in the Districs of Quebec and Montreal, in order that the persons therein-confined may be kept at uleful labour by working fuch Mill; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth " year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provifion for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America. Preamble.

TATHEREAS the Laws now in force, make no difference between the mode of proceeding to computery and voluntary Sheriff's Sales, (décréts) with refmed to formalities and expenses which are abled in both cases, and whereas the rendering voluntary. Sheriff's Sales more easy and less expensive, would be very beneficial to the public: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Mejesty. by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflicted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled Mr Act " to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's " reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and comake further provision for the 46.
