fame in prefence of the parties, or upon their having been duly fummoned and shall report the appraisement to the Grand Voyer or his Deputy; and that the price which fhall be fixed by (uch appraisement, shall be the price of the faid purchase, but that in case the faid Experts differ in opinion the Grand Voyer or his Deputy shall anpoint a third Expert, who shall proceed with the two Experts to a new inspection and estimation, and that the apprailement which shall then be made by the faid Experts and third Expert, or a majority of them, fhall be final and conclusive; and that the faid furveyor and overfeers, or a majority of them upon tendering to the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, his heirs or affigns, the price of the faid Bridge, at the rate at which the fame was apprailed, or on his or their refulal to accept the fame. upon depositing the same, at the office of the Court of King's Bench for the Dis. trie of Quebec for his or their use, may forthwith, take possession of the faid Bridge and of the appurtenances for the use of the Inhabitants of the faid parish to syhom the faid Bridge and its appurtenances, fhall thenceforth for ever, belong and appertain, and shall be held and confidered to be a Public Buidge, and shall be maintained, according to Law, and to fuch Procès Verbal or Procès Verbaux, as may in that behalf be ratified.

CAP. XXXIV.

AN Act for the relief of George Waters Allfopp, and others therein mentioned, with respect to the erection of a Bridge over the River Jacques Cartier, pursuant to a certain Act of the Legislature of this Province, therein mentioned.

Preamble.

W HEREAS by an A& paffed in the fifty-ninth year of the Reign of His late Majefty, George the Third, Chapter the twenty-feventh, intituled, "An "A& to authorife George Waters Allfopp, Efquire, and others therein-mentioned, "to build a Toll Bridge over the River Jacques Cartier, in the County of Hamp-"fine "; it is ena&ed that it fhall be lawful to George Waters Allfopp Robert Allfopp and Anna Maria Allfopp, to erect and build a Bridge over the River Jacques Cartier, on certain conditions, fully fet forth in the faid A&, and that the faid George Waters Allfopp, Robert Allfopp and Anna Maria Allfopp have complied w th all the conditions and requirements of the faid A&, and have caufed to be crected and built a Bridge over the faid River, which before the fame was received and

and approved, according to Law, was in part carried away by the high waters during the last fpring, and that without a longer delay than that provided by the faid A& for completing the faid Bridge, it would be impossible for the faid George Waters Allfopp and others to continue their undertaking, whereby confiderable damage to them and injury to the public at large, would be occasioned by delaying the crection of a Bridge, which is of acknowle Iged utility : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An A& to repeal cortain parts of an A& paffed in the " fourteenth year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual " provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to

" make further provision for the Government of the faid Province"; and it is here-Extension of by enacted by the authority of the fame, that the faid George Waters Allfopp, Ro-the time granted by the authority of the fame, that the faid George Waters Allfopp, Ro-to George Waters bert Allfopp and Anna Maria Allfopp, in order to entitle themfelves to the bene-building a bridge fits and advantages unto them granted by the faid Act, fhall, and they are hereby even the River Jacques Cartier, required to erect and complete, the faid Bridge, Toll Houfe, Tarnpike and other dependencies within three years from the passing of this ACt; and if the fame be not completed within the time last mentioned, in such manner as to procure a safe and commodious paffage over the faid Bridge, the faid George Waters Allfopp, Robert Allfopp and Anna Maria Allfopp, their heirs, executors, curators and allight, shall cease to have any right or claim to the Tolls imposed by the laid AC, which subject to the fhall thenceforth belong to His Majesty. Provided always that the faid George The Geo. 5, cap. Waters Allfopp, Robert Allfopp, and Anna Maria Allfopp fhall in all refpects conform to every other condition and requirement in the faid A& mentioned.
