Preamble

HEREAS the Governor in Chief did by a Message to both Houses of the Lee giflature of this Province, in the year one thouland eight hundred and twenty-one, fignify the high f nfe entertained by Your Majesty of the services of the Honorabie 1 mes Monk, Chief Justice of the Court of King's Bonch for the Diftrict of Montreal, during the left forty years of his life, and did also earnestly recommend that a liberal provision might be made for him on his retirement from office .- And Whereas the Governor in Chief, by another Message to both Houses of the Legislature in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, did also figurify the high sense Your Majesty entertained of the services of the Honorabie Isaac Ogden, one of the Judges of Your Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the Diffrict of Montreal, and did earn if y recommend that a liberal provision for him on his retirement should be made, in consideration of his long services and extreme age: -Now, therefore, We Your Majesty's most duriful and loyal subjects the Commons of Lower-Canada in Provincial Parliament affembled, having taken the fame

into confideration and having resolved to grant to Your Majesty the annual sum of five hundred and fifty pounds, steeling, to enable Your Majesty to pay a Pension to the Honorable James Monk, during his life, upon his retising from the Bench. as Chief Justice of the District of Montreal, and the annual sum of four hundred and fifty pounds, sterling, to pay a pension to the Honorable Isaac Ogden, one of the Judges of the Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal during his life. humbly befrech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Ad for making more effectual of provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America; and to " make further provision for the government of the faid Province"; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that out of the unappropriated monies that now are in, or that hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province for the time being, there shall be annually paid by a Warrant or Ware rants under the hand of the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, the fum of five hundred and fifty pounds, sterling, as a pension to the Honorable James Monk, during his natural life, on his retirement from the office of Chief Justice of the Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal, and the further sum of four hundred and fifty pounds, fterling, as a perison to the Honorable Isaac Ogden on his retirement from office as a Judge of the aforesaid Court of King's Bench for the District of Monte real, for and during his natural life.
