47 George III – Chapter 3

An Act to continue for a limited time, An Act passed in the forty-second year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the more effectual regulation of the Police within the Cities of Quebec and Montreal and Town of Three-Rivers; also, for extending regulation of Police to other Towns and Villages in certain cases, and for repealing the Acts or Ordinances therein mentioned." (16th April, 1807.)

Whereas An Act was passed by the Legislature of this Province in the forty-second year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the more effectual regulation of the Police within the Cities of Quebec and Montreal and Town of Three-Rivers [Trois-Rivières]; also, for extending Regulations of Police to other Towns and villages in certain cafes and for repealing the Acts or Ordinances therein mentioned," which Act is to have continuance only until the end of the present Session of the Provincial Parliament, And Whereas it is necessary that the said Act should be continued. Be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of An Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of An Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act, intituled, "An Act to provide for the more effectual regulation of the Police within the Cities of Quebec and Montreal and Town of Three-Rivers; also for extending regulations of Police to other Towns and Villages in certain cafes and for repealing the Acts or Ordinances therein mentioned." And all matters and things therein contained, shall continue and be in force until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer. Provided always, that all and every Order or Orders issued and published under the authority of the aforesaid Act, or which shall be issued and published under the authority of this Act, shall not continue to be in force longer than to the said first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament.
