An Act to appropriate a further Sum of Money towards the payment of certain arrears due for the erection of a Common Gaol, in the District of Quebec. (22 March, 1817.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas the monies heretofore appropriated for the erection of a Common Gaol in the District of Quebec, have been found insufficient, and whereas it is necessary to appropriate a further sum for the payment of certain arrears due for the erection of the same, by the Commissioners appointed under and in virtue of an Act passed in the forty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the erecting of a Common Gaol in each of the Districts of Quebec and Montreal respectively, and the means for defraying the expences thereof;" may it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision of the Government of the Province of Quebec in North-America;' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and maybe lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or person administering the government of this Province for the time being, by warrant or warrants under his hand and seal, directed to the Receiver-General of this Province, to issue to the Commissioners appointed under and in virtue of the above-mentioned Act, or to any one of them, for the purposes above-mentioned, the sum of eleven hundred and six Pounds, two Shillings, current money of this Province, out of any of the unappropriated monies which now are or which may hereafter come into the hand of the Receiver-General of this Province, and which have been or shall be levied or collected under any Act or Acts of the Legislature of this Province.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the said monies appropriated pursuant to the directions of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall direct.
