58 George III – Chapter 7

An Act to grant to the Religious Ladies Hospitalières, of the Hôtel-Dieu of Quebec, a certain sum of Money for the purposes therein mentioned. (1st April, 1818.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas the utility and benefit derived to the City and District of Quebec, from the Ancient Establishment of the Hôtel-Dieu of Quebec, are of public notoriety; and whereas, these advantages would be greatly multiplied, by affording means to the Religious Ladies, Hospitalières of the said Hôtel-Dieu, to erect new Wards for the reception and relief of the sick, as by their Petition to that effect the said Religions Ladies, Hospitalières, have represented and prayed. May it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the government of this Province for the time being, to advance to the Religious Ladies, Hospitalières of the aforesaid Hôtel-Dieu of Quebec, by a warrant or warrants, out of the unappropriated monies which now are, or which at any time hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province for the time being, the sum of six thousand pounds, current money of this Province, to be by them laid out, and appropriated in building and erecting new wards, contiguous to, or adjoining the aforesaid Hôtel-Dieu, for the reception and relief of the sick.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the aforesaid sum of money hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.
