59 George III – Chapter 11

An Act to continue for a limited time two several Acts therein-mentioned to regulate persons engaged in the trade of baking and selling Bread in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal and in the Town of Three Rivers. (24th April, 1819.)

Whereas an Act was passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to regulate persons engaged in the business or trade of Baking and Selling Bread, within the cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the town of Three Rivers [Trois-Rivières]; and to repeal an Ordinance therein mentioned," which said Act was by an Act passed in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act to regulate persons engaged in the business or trade of baking and selling bread, within the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the Town of Three Rivers; and to repeal an Ordinance therein-mentioned,'" in part altered, amended and continued, until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, on which day the same will expire: And whereas it is expedient further to continue, for a limited time, the aforesaid Act first above mentioned, as altered and amended by the last mentioned Act: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed In the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate persons engaged in the business or trade of baking and selling bread, within the cities of Quebec and Montreal and in the town of Three Rivers; and to repeal an Ordinance therein-mentioned," and all and every the matters and things in the said Act, contained, except in as much as the same are altered and amended by the above-mentioned Act passed in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act to regulate persons engaged in the business or trade of baking and selling bread within the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the Town of Three Rivers; and to repeal an Ordinance therein-mentioned,'" shall further continue to be in force, together with all and every the matters and things mentioned and contained in the said Act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to continue an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act to regulate the persons engaged in the Business or Trade of Baking and Selling Breads in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the Town of Three- Rivers, and to repeal an Ordinance therein-mentioned," until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one and no longer.
