59 George III – Chapter 25

An Act to make good a certain sum of money therein-mentioned, advanced to defray the expences of the Civil Government of this Province for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen. (24th April, 1819.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas pursuant to an Address from Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Commons of this Province, during the last Session of the present Provincial Parliament, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, to the then Governor in Chief, the sum of forty thousand two hundred and sixty three pounds eight shillings and nine pence, current money of this Province has been advanced towards defraying the expences of your Majesty's Civil Government of this Province, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, over and above the sums already appropriated by law for that purpose, whereby it is expedient to make good the monies so as aforesaid advanced for the purpose above-mentioned, pursuant to a vote of the Commons of this Province, bearing date the day and year aforesaid. Now, therefore, we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Commons of Lower-Canada in Provincial Parliament assembled, do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said sum of forty thousand two hundred and sixty-three pounds eight shillings and nine pence, current money aforesaid, so as aforesaid advanced towards defraying the expences of the Civil Government of this Province for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, shall be and the same is hereby directed to be charged against the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, which may have been raised, levied and collected under and by virtue of any Act or Acts of the Legislature of this Province.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the sum to be charged as by this act is directed, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.
