1 George IV – Chapter 21

An Act to revive and continue for a limited time two certain Acts therein-mentioned, for regulating and facilitating the Trial of controverted Elections or returns of Members to serve in the House of Assembly. (17th March, 1821.)

Whereas an Act, passed in the forty-eight year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Trial of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in the House of Assembly of Lower-Canada," also a certain other Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to facilitate the Trial of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in the House of Assembly;" did on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, respectively expire; And whereas it is expedient that the above recited Acts be revived and continued in force for a limited time; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said act, passed in the forty-eighth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Trial of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in the House of Assembly of Lower-Canada," also the aforesaid Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to facilitate the Trial of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in the House of Assembly," and all the clauses, provisions, powers, authorities, directions and regulations therein respectively contained, shall be, and the same are hereby revived, and shall be and remain in full force and authority until the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five and no longer, in as full and ample a manner, to all intents and purposes, as if the same were repeated and re-enacted in the body of this Act.
