2 George IV - Chapter 13

An Act to continue for a limited time, An Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Police of certain Boroughs and Villages." (18th February, 1822.)

Whereas an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Police of certain Boroughs and Villages," is to expire on the first day of May next, which said Act it is expedient to continue for a limited time; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Police of certain Boroughs and Villages," and all and every the matters and things therein-mentioned and contained, shall be and remain in full force and effect, until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, and no longer.
