2 George IV – Chapter 2

An Act to provide for the better inspection of Flour. (18th February, 1822.)

Whereas it is expedient to make further provision for the inspection of Flour than hath heretofore been made; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue, of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that when any Flour inspected, according to the Laws in force in this Province, shall hereafter, on inspection, be found, four, the barrel containing such flour, in addition to the marks by Law required to be thereupon branded, shall also be branded with the word, Sour, immediately under the brand by Law so as aforesaid required.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, no Inspector of Flour shall be entitled to demand or receive for the Inspection of Flour, and branding, as by Law provided, any more than two pence per barrel, any Law, Statute or usage to the contrary heretofore in any wise notwithstanding.
