2 George IV – Chapter 6

An Act to amend and rectify the operation of an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to establish a House of Industry in the City of Montreal." (18th February, 1822.)

Whereas the second Clause of an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to establish a House of Industry in the City of Montreal," will in its operation be attended with inconvenience, and in some measure will not answer the intended purpose; Now therefore to rectify the same, be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;'" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that instead of four Wardens for the House of Industry in the City of Montreal, who in pursuance of the second Section of the said Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to establish a House of Industry in the City of Montreal," are to be appointed on the first day of April next, eight wardens for the House of Industry in the said City of Montreal, shall be then appointed, of whom four shall retire by rotation and be replaced by an equal number at the expiration of every two succeeding years, as in and by the said Act prescribed, so that according to the intention of the said Act, the Corporation of the "Wardens of the House of Industry in the City of Montreal," may invariably consist of eight wardens, and not less.
