An Act to appropriate a sum of money therein-mentioned, to indemnify Benjamin Ecuyer, for certain Plans of the City of Quebec by him prepared. (22d. March, 1823.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a sum of money to indemnify Benjamin Ecuyer, Land Surveyor, for certain plans of the City of Quebec and estimates relating to common sewers, intended to be made in the said City, which plans and estimates have been made by order of His Majesty's Government, pursuant to an Address of the House of Assembly to His Excellency the Administrator in Chief of the twenty-seventh of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen; May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being by a Warrant or Warrants, under his hand to advance and pay out of the unappropriated monies that now are or that hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province for the time being, to Benjamin Ecuyer, Land surveyor, the sum of sixty pounds, currency, to indemnify him for certain plans of the City of Quebec and estimates of common sewers, intended to be made in the said City by him the said Benjamin Ecuyer, Land surveyor, made and prepared by direction of certain Justices of the Peace for the District of Quebec, by order of His Majesty's Government, pursuant to an Address of the House of Assembly to His Excellency, the Administrator in Chief, of the twenty-seventh of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the sum of money by this Act authorized to be paid, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be pleased to direct.
