3 George IV – Chapter 5

An Act further to continue for a limited time, an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide more effectually for the security of the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, by establishing a Watch and Night Lights in the said Cities, and for other purposes." (22d. March, 1823.)

Whereas it is expedient further to continue, for a limited time, an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide more effectually for the security of the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and for establishing a Watch and Night Lights in the said Cities, and for other purposes," the duration whereof, by an Act passed in the first year of the Reign of His present Majesty, Chapter eleventh, hath been extended and is also thereby limited to the first day of May, one thousand, eight hundred and twenty-three, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide more effectually for the security of the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, by establishing a Watch and Night Lights in the said Cities, and for other purposes"; shall further continue to be and remain in force, and all and every the duties by the said Act imposed, shall be raised, levied and collected and paid as therein-mentioned and provided, and all and every the clauses, matters and things in the said Act mentioned and contained, shall also further continue to be and remain in full force and effect, until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this, as well as the above-mentioned Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's Reign, may be altered, amended or repealed, by an Act or Acts of the Legislature of this Province, if need be, during the present Session of the same.
