CAP.I.

An ACT for ESTABLISHING a MILI-TIA, in the Province of NEW-BRUNS-WICK, and for regulating the fame.

HEREAS a well regulated Militia in this Province, Preamble, will tend not only to the fecurity and defence thereof, but to the honor and fervice of his Majefty.

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, the Council, and Every perfor from Aljembly, That within three months after the paffing of this act, every perfon refiding within this province, from fixteen to fifty years of age, and every perfon that is under fixteen, within one month after he arrives at the age of fixteen, shall inlift himfelf infome company. with the Captain, or in his absence with the next commanding officer of one of the independent companies, in the town or parish, or of the regimental company of foot where he dwells, or refides, under the penalty of five shillings, and three shillings for every month that fuch perfon shall remain unlisted. And all Captains of independent and regimented companies, in the mains uninlifted. feveral towns and parifhes within this province, are hereby commanded, to take due care to inlift all inhabitants from fixteen to fifty years of age, which age in cafe of doubt is to be proved by the oath of the perfon whole age is in question, or the oath

" do fwear, upon the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God, that ٤ د fammoned before Captain in order ć : to be inlifted, is years old, and no more according " to the beft of my knowledge. So help me God." Which oath being duly administered by the Captain or other officer, who hath fummoned fuch perfon before him in order to be inlifted, and it appearing that he is under fixteen, he shall be for that time difmiffed; and if any dispute shall arise about older perfons, and it shall appear that he or they are above the age of fifty, fuch perfons shall be exempted at all times thereafter.

Captains ihall provide drums, fifes, &c. to be paid for out of the fines, under penalty of two pounds, and for every month they remain unprovided one pound.

Commandingoffcers of regiments, and unregimented companies shall once a year iffue warrants to inferior officers to fearch that all perfons be duly lifted, armed, &c. and return the names of defaul-

Once a year if the Commander in, chief gives orders, the commanding officers of regiments shall command the feveral companies to meet at fuch convenient place as they finall appoint to be mul-

Independent computies fitall meet twice a year to be muttered and esesciled.

And be it enached, That all Captains of independent or Π. regimented Companies, shall provide for their companies, drums, fifes, colours and banners, and drummers and fiters, to be paid. for out of the fines and forfeitures to be incurred by this act, under the penalty of two pounds, and for every month fuch-Captain thall remain unprovided thereof, the fum of one pound.

III. Be it further enabled, That the Colonels, or commanding officers of all regiments or battalions, or unregimented companies within this province, fhall at leaft once in every year, iffue out their warrants to their inferior officers, commanding him or them to make diligent fearch and inquiry in their fevein their diffricts, ral diffricts, that all perfons be duly lifted, armed, and equipped ;. and to return to them the names of fuch defaulter, as he or they thall find, to the end they may be punished according tothis act.

And be it also enacted, That once in every year, if the IV. Captain-General or Commander in Chief thall give orders therefor, command shall be given by the Colonels, and in his ablence: by the next commanding officer of the respective regiments or battalions, that the feveral companies in each regiment or battalion fhall meet at the most convenient place therein to be appointed by the respective officer commanding the regiment or tered & exercised, battalion, to be then and there muftered and exercised; and the feveral independent companies in this province thall meet twice in every year, at the most convenient place, to be appointed by the respective officers commanding them to be multered and exercifed; and once in every year and not oftener, command

V. And be it further enabled, That in cafe of a general Incaseof ageneral alarm or invation, all unregimented or independent companies companies mathing fhall in the absence of the Captain=General or Commander in Chief, be under the immediate command and direction of the chief, beunder the Colonel, and in his abfence the next commanding officer of the regiment or battalion of the city, county, town, or diffrict, where fuch unregimented or independent companies may be.

And be it enacted; That the independent companies in VI. this province are to confift; each, of fifty men, befides officers, panies to confift of and if the Colonel or commanding officer of the regiment or battalion in the city, or in any town or parifh, where there is an independent company or companies, shall have reason to fuppole, that the Captain or Captains of the faid company or companies have inlitted a greater number of men than is limited aboye, fuch Captain or Captains shall within fifteen days after notice, deliver to the Captain-General or Commander in Chief, such Captains thall or to fuch perfon as he fhall appoint to receive the fame, a true and compleat roll of the name of every perfon he or they have on his lift; and if it thereby appears that more are inlifted fon as he shall apthan the number above-mentioned, all fuch fupernumerary men shall be immediately discharged out of such list, and the Captain or Captains shall give a lift of their names to the Colonel or next commanding officer aforefaid; and the perfon or perfons fo discharged, shall within fifteen days thereafter inlist him or themfelves in one of the companies of the faid regiment or battalion; and fuch of the perfons fo difcharged, as shall omit to inlift themselves accordingly, shall be subject to the fines inflict- faid regiment. ed in this act on perfons omitting or neglecting to inlift in the Militia.

Upon notice of a general mufter of any company, no perfon inlifted shall ablent himself without leave under penalty of 10%.

No commissioned officer shall withdraw himfelf without leave from his juperior officerunder penalty of 40f. No serjeant, corfiler, under 20f.

If any perfon in-Islied shall when required, refuie to warn the people under arms, he hall forfeit 20 f.

Every foldier in. liked who shall when under arms refuse to perform fuch duty as fhall

nine cartridges of gun-powder, and nine fizeable bullets; and fo provided thall appear, when and where required as aforefaid, upon penalty of three shillings for each mulket or fusee not well fixed, and for want of a proper bayonet, belt, or cartridge-box, shall forfeit for each one shilling, and the fame fum for want of each cartridge or bullet; the whole penalty for the default of or bullet, so that one perfon for one day not to exceed ten shillings, and the fufficiency of the mulket or fusee, bayonet, belt, and cartridgebox, shall be judged of and determined by the commanding officer then prefent. And every foldier shall at his habitation or place of abode, have one pound of good gun-powder, and Every foldier than three pounds of fizeable bullets, upon penalty of ten shillings for each foldier. And if any foldier shall refuse to show to his Captain or perfon fent by him or other officer for that purpole by this act appointed, all or any of the equipage, arms or ammunition herein mentioned, he shall be deemed and esteemed. be deemed unpro- to be unprovided thereof, and fhall be fined accordingly.

VIII. And be it enacted, That upon notice given of a general mufter, or of the review, or appearance in the field of any particular company or companies as aforefaid, no perfon whatfoever inlifted in the Militia in manner aforefaid, shall absent or withdraw himfelf from the fervice without having first obtained leave of his Captain or commanding officer, fo to do, under the penalty of ten shillings; and no commissioned officer shall remove himfelf out of the town, parifh or diffrict, or withdraw from the fervice without leave from his fuperior officer, under. the penalty of forty fhillings; and no ferjeant, corporal, drummer or hifer, shall absent themselves in manner aforesaid, under. poral, or mmer or the penalty of twenty fbillings.

> IX. And be it further enacted, That if any perfon or perfons being duly inlifted, if thereunto required by their fuperior and proper officer, shall refuse to warn the people to appear under arms when thereunto required by his Captain or next commanding officer, he shall for every such neglect or resulal forfeit the fum of twenty fhillings.

And be it enacted, That every foldier inlifted, to ferve · X. either in regimented or independent companies, and appearing under arms, and during fuch appearance, who shall refuse or neglect neglect to perform fuch military duty, as shall be required from be required, or him, or shall depart from his colours or guard without leave from the commanding officer, shall forfeit twenty shillings; and for non-payment thereof, shall be committed by warrant from the commanding officer then prefent to the next goal, till the faid twenty skillings be paid, with the prifon charges; and the fine and charges theriff of fuch county and city, is hereby required to receive the body or bodies of fuch offender or offenders against this act, as shall be brought to him by virtue of a warrant or warrants under the hand and feal of fuch officer as aforefaid, and him or them to keep in fafe cuftody, until fuch fees and fines mentioned in fuch warrant are paid. And fuch theriff or keepers of goals the tame fees as in shall be intitled to the fame fees as are allowed in other cafes, and the fines to recovered, thall be disposed of by the commanding officer, for the benefit of the company to which company. the offender doth belong.

And for all other penalties and forfeitures in this act mentioned, the fame shall be levied by diffress and fale of the offenders goods by warrant, from the Colonel, or the next field-officer where fuch offenders are; which forfeiture and penalty thall be for that befor the ute the use and benefit of the regiment or battalion in the city, town, or county where the offence is committed; and the ferjeants and corporals of the regiment or battalion, are to referve polarizationelevers to themfelves, out of the diffress or forfeiture, the fum of three executing each B fallings,

fhillings, for executing each warrant from their Captain or other fuperior officer.

Drummers and fafers fhall ferve for 20/, a year if they find drum & fife; if the Captains find them for 10/. Each drummer & fifer refufing to ferve fhall forfeit 20/. Perfons to be exempted from being inlifted in the Multita.

No commissioned officer Fable to ferve as Conflable,

In cale of an alarm invalion, or rebellion, every officer. fhall raile the Militia under his command, & fend immediate inteiligence to the commanding officer of the regiment, who thall forward it io the nextcommand ing officer, and let him know how he iatends to proceed, Commanding officers in the counties thall dispatch an expreis to the Commander in Calef, solifying the danger, &c. and fail have power to impreis boats, men, and borles, to draw together the militia, and march them where they fhall thick best for oppoling the enemy, and to fuch places within the proXII. And be it enacted, That all Drummers and Fifers that fhall be put in fervice by the feveral Captains, fhall ferve upon the falary of *twenty fhillings* per year, if they find Drum and Fife, and if the Captain finds the Drums and Fifes, then they fhall ferve for one half that fum, and each Drummer or Fifer refufing to ferve fhall forfeit *twenty fhillings*, to be levied in manner aforefaid. Always provided, that the Members of his Majefty's Council, Members of the Affembly, Juffices of the Peace, High Sheriffs, Coroners, and all perfons that have held any commiftion, Civil or Military under his Majefty, Miniflers of the Gofpel, Phyficians, Surgeons, School-Mafters, one Miller to a Grift Mill, and one Ferryman to every public Ferry, fhall be free from being lifted in the Militia of this Province.

KIII. And be it enacted, That no Milicia commissioned offacer in this Province shall be liable, or subject to ferve as Constable; any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That in cafe of an alarm, invalion, infurrection or rebellion, every officer of the Militia fhall have full power and authority, by virtue of this act, and is hereby required forthwith to raife the Militia or company under his command, and to fend immediate intelligence to the commanding officer of the regiment or battalion to which he belongs, who also are hereby required to fend forward the intelligence forthwith to the commanding officer of the next adjacent counties, informing him and them at the fame time in what manner he intends to proceed : And every commanding officer in every county upon any alarm, or receiving intelligence of any infurrection, invation or rebellion, thall forthwith difpatch an express to the Captain-General or Commander in Chief for the time being, notifying the danger, and shall therewith fignify the firength and motions of the enemy, and the faid commanding officer hath hereby full power to imprefs boats, men and horfes, as the fervice may require, and shall draw together the Militia of his county, town, or parifh, or such part thereof as he thall think neceffary, and march them to fuch place or places as he shall judge most convenient for opposing the enemy, and to fuch place or places within this province, as fhall be direffed

rected by the Captain-General or Commander in Chief for the vince as the Comtime being. And every Captain or commissioned officer under the degree of Major, that shall negled or refuse to perform his duty hereby required, shall forfeit the sum of twenty pounds. And every non-commissioned officer or private man for his neglect or refulal of fuch duty; shall forfeit the fum of five pounds. And every fuch commissioned officers, besides paying such forfeitures, shall be degraded, and rendered incapable thereaster of holding or exercifing any office civil or military within this province.

XV. And be it enalled, That if any perfon or perfons fhall be fued, molefted, or impleaded for any matter or thing lawfully done and commanded in the execution and performance of this act, he or they may plead the general iffue, and give this act in evidence, and if the plantiff difcontinue his action, be nonfaited, or a verdici pais against him, the defendant shall recover treble coffs, nor thall any fuch fuits be brought unlefs within three months next after the offence is committed.

XVI. And be it enasted, That once in every year, and oftener if thereunto required, each Captain fhail give to his Colonel, or in his ablence to the next field-officer, and fuch field-officer, and the Captains of unregimented companies, to the Captain General or commander in chief for the time being, fair written Rolls of their respective Regiments and companies, on the penaky of farty skillings; and if any perfon be wounded or difabled upon any invation, infurrection or rebellion, he thall be uken care of, and provided for, by the public during the time of fuch difability. Provided alway, and it is enacted, that all per- at the public esfons above the age of filty, and not enceeling fixty years of age, fhall in case of an alarm, invalion, infurrection or rebellion, ap- ferrans dictor pear under arms, under the Captain, or commanding officer or invite sethe diffrict where they dwell or refide, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithflanding.

Provided always, That every perfon professing himself to be of the people called Quakers, and producing to the Captain or commanding officer of the company, in whole diffrict or heat he relides, a certificate from one of their meetings, figured by fix or more of the principal people of fuch meeting, that fuch perfon had been deemed and allowed one of the people called Quakers, for the fpace of one whole year or upwards before the d.t=

XVIII. And be it enacted, That this act shall be and remain till the 1st March, in force till the first day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Two, and no longer.

CAP.II.

An ACT to AUTHORIZE the respective PROPRIETORS of certain Islands in the River ST. JOHN, and other Rivers in this PROVINCE, to make rules and regulations for their better improvement and cultivation.

Proprietors of the Iflands may meet once a year on the first day of the winter lesions, in the county,

and by a major vote may pais orders and rules for the hufbandry and improvement of the faid Islandsthe votes to be c:1lected according to the respective rights or thares nnder actual cultivation. And if any of the faid Proprietors shall.

INTHEREAS there are many Islands lying in the River Saint John, and other rivers in this Province, owned in finall rights or fhares, and on which division fences are liable to be carried away by the current, and prefiure of the water paffing in times of freshes over the fame.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and I. Affembly, That the respective proprietors of the faid Islands may and are hereby authorifed to meet once a year, on the first day of the winter Seffions, in the respective counties in which such illands are included; and fuch and fo many of the respective proprietors of the faid illands as shall be prefent, shall have power by a major vote to make and pafs orders, rules and regulations for the managing, improving, and better hufbandry of the faid iflands, the voices of the respective proprietors present to be collected according to their respective rights or shares under actual cultivation and improvement. And if any of the faid proprietors shall in disobedience of the votes, orders, rules and regulations, fo made and paffed, occupy, hulband, manage or improve his, her or their refpective fhares or rights, contrary to fuch
