CAP. VI.

An ACT for laying an IMPOST.

DE IT ENACTED by the Licuinant Governor Council and Detter strand Affembly, That from and after the thirtieth day of October inteant, there be and hereby is granted to his Majefty his heirs band in the state of the state and fucceffors for the use of this province, and for the support of ther, the government thereof, the leveral rates and duties on the articles hereafter mentioned which fliall or may be brought or imported into any port or place within this province except the produce or manufacture of Great Britain or Ireland directly imported from thence, to be paid by the importers thereof that is to fay-for every galion of rum or other diffilled fpirituous liquors two pence-for every groß hundred weight of brown lugar two fhillings when landed, allowing twenty per cent. for tare-for every pound of coffee one peany,-and for every barrel of wheat flour, the growth produce or manufacture of any or either of the United States of America two thillings and fo in proportion for a greater or lefter quantity.

II. IV. And be it further enacted, That upon all goods not herein before made liable to a duty, which shall from and after the thirtieth day of this inftant month of October be imported into this province except from Great-Britain or Ireland or the growth, produce, or manufacture of fome British colony or plantation, there shall be paid a duty of five pounds for every one hundred pounds Articles except- in value prime coft, except live flock, grain of all kinds, falt and all goods liable by Act of Parliament to pay a duty to his Majesty.

V. And be it further enasted, That for all merchandize of what nature or kind foever, imported by or belonging to any perfon or perfons not refident in this province there shall be paid a duty of five pounds for every one hundred pounds value prime coft, at the place from whence the fame was imported, and fo in proportion for a greater or leffer quantity—except fuch goods belong to fome perfon or perfons fubjects and inhabitants of Great Britain or Ire-Prime coff to be land, and are imported directly from thence; which prime coft shall be afcertained by a manifest of the cargo to be lodged in the treasurer's office or that of his deputy by the master owner or agent of any veffel importing fuch goods or merchandize, who shall enter at fuch office, and there report his whole cargo and make oath to the truth of his manifest within forty eight hours after his arrival at fuch port, and make true report of every parcel of goods or commodities he may have on board, enumerating the quantity and quality of the fame, to whom belonging and to whom configned; and in cafe of neglect or refufal of fuch owner, mafter, or agent, all goods not fo reported shall be liable to forfeiture, and may be feized and proceeded with to condemnation, and divided and applied in the manner herein before directed; Provided always, that in cafe the mafter cannot make oath to the property the burthen of proof shall lie upon the confignce. VI. And be it further enabled, That for the recovery of fuch of Tresfurer to face for duties. the duties as are imposed by this act and shall not be paid within :three months or fix months as aforefaid respectively after the entry thereof, the faid treasurer shall be empowered to cause process to be iffued against all and every perion and perions who shall ftand indebted for duties longer than the faid respective times allowed for the payment thereof.

VII. And be it further enacted, That if the laid treasurer shall Upon neglea to not caule process to be made for any duties to arise by virtue of for the fame. this act at the end of the faid respective times hereby limited for , the payment thereof, he shall be answerable for the same within , one month thereafter as though the fame had been actually re-.ceived.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the treasurer of the The treasurer to province for the time being shall nominate fit perfons to be approved of by the Lieutenant Governor in the feveral counties in this province to receive the feveral duties and impofitions laid and impoled by this act; which perfons fo appointed shall give good and furficient fecurity to fuch treasurer for the faithful discharge of «their duty and be accountable for all fums fo to be received by virtue of this act to the treasurer when thereunto required; which perfons to appointed thall have the fame powers to make feizures feizures and reand proceed to condemnation as are given to the treasurer by virtue of this act, and may retain ten pounds for every hundred pounds , they shall fo receive in full for their trouble and fervices.

IX. And be it further enacted, That all the money to arife by , virtue of this act shall remain in the treasury until the same shall - be disposed of by an act or acts of the legislature of the province to ; be pailed for that purpose.

X. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful The tressourer in for the treasurer of the province in case of fickness or necessary abfence from the city and county of Saint John to appoint a fit perfon to act as his deputy in the fame city and county for whofe acts' the faid treasurer thall be responsible, which deputy thall have deputies. the fame power and authority to act in every refpect as any deputy of the faid treasurer in any other county in this province can or may have by virtue of this aft; Provided always, that fuch deputy thall not be entitled to the allowance of ten per cent hereby given to the other deputies, any thing herein before contained to the contrary in any wife notwithstanding.

And if after fuch entry made at the treasurer's onice as aforefaid there shall be found landed from or on board fuch thip or vefiel any dutiable goods not duly entered at the treasurer's office agreeable to the directions of this act, or if any fuch dutiable goods shall at any time be found to have been landed from any ship or vessel contrary to the provisions of this act. then the faid perfon to to be appointed is hereby authorifed and empowered to detain fuch thip or veffel and all fuch goods as aforefaid and shall immediately make report thereof to the treasurer who is hereby authorifed and empowered to feize and profecute the fame And fuch thip or vefiel and all fuch goods fo to condemnation. feized are hereby declared to be forfeited, and shall be proceeded against as directed in the third fection of this act, and fuch perfor fo detaining fuch thip, vefiel or goods thall have and receive one moiety of the third part of fuch forfeiture, herein before directed to be paid to the officer feizing and profecuting the fame.

Rum to be genged by Gunter's calipers.- XII. Aid be it further enailed, That the quantities of rum fo imported thall be afcertained by the inftrument commonly called by the name of Gunter's callipers and by no other inftrument whatever, and fhall be to gauged by a fivorn gauger legally appointed or to be appointed in the city of Saint John, and in the feveral and refpective counties, or in cafe of the ficknels or abfence of any fuch gauger or in cafe no fuch gauger thall be appointed, then by a fivorn gauger to be for that purpofe appointed by the treafurer or his deputy.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That every perfon who shall

be convicted of making or taking a falle oath to any of the facts

herein before directed or required to be fworn, shall be deemed

guilty of perjury and shall be liable to the pains and penalties to

which perfons are liable for wilful and corrupt perjury.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force until the first day of March which will be in in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one, and no longer.
