## CAP. VII.

An ACT for regulating, laying out and repairing HIGHWAYS and ROADS and for appointing CCMMISSION-ERS and SURVEYORS of Highways within the feveral Towns or Parishes in this Province, and for suspending for a limited Time, all the Laws now in force relating to the same. Passed the 12th March, 1796.

I. DEITENACTED, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That an act made and passed lating to roads in the twenty fixth year of His MAJESTY'S Reign intituled, and highways " An Act for laying out, repairing and amending Highways, Roads the term of five " and Streets, and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors the operation " of Highways within the Jeveral Towns or Parifies in this Pro- of this all. "vince" also an act made and passed in the thirty sirst year of His MAJESTY's Reign intituled, " An Act in addition to and " in amendment of an Act intituled, " An Act for laying out, repairing, and amending Highways, Roads and Streets, and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways within the several Towns or Parishes in this Province," be and the fame are hereby suspended for the term of five years or during the operation of this act.

II. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners and Commissioners and Surveyors Surveyors already appointed by virtue of the faid act, shall con-appointed by tinue in their respective Offices until others shall be appointed eract, to conand sworn as is hereaster directed; and that the Justices at their General Sessions to be held for the several counties next ed and sworn. after the first day of January annually shall appoint a number of fit persons, not exceeding five nor less than three, to be Commissioners to lay out and regulate highways and roads in the town or parish for which they shall be so appointed; and the said In suture not less than three Justices at the same time shall appoint a number of sit persons nor more than not exceeding eight nor less than three to be Surveyors of the five Commissioners, and not faid highways in each town or parish, who are to oversee and less than thee repair in the manner herein after directed the several highways eight Surveyors. within the respective towns or parishes for which they shall be to be annually appointed in appointed;

each pariffs, who are to be fworn to the faithful difcharge of their respective duties

and for refulal or neglect of duty to forfeit three pounds.

Lifts of fuch appointments to be fent by the Clerks of the Peace to the Clerks of the setpective pasishers

Commissioners authorised to lay our high-ways, and to alter any roads already laid out, if upon the oath of twelve free-holders, to be fummoner by warrant of two Justices, it shall appear to be secretary, or,

appointed; which faid Commissioners and Surveyors shall be fworn to the faithful discharge of their respective offices for the year ensuing before the said Sessions or before any one of the Justices of the Peace within or nearest to the said town or parish for which such Commissioners or Surveyors shall be so aprointed: And any person, being so nominated and appointed who shall refuse to accept of such office, to which he shall be so nominated and appointed, or shall neglect to be sworn as aforesaid within fourteen days next after being duly notified of such nomination, or having accepted shall neglect his duty, shall forfeit for every refulal or neglect three pounds, to be recovered, with costs of suit, before any two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace; and the forfeiture shall be applied for the repairing of the highways. And it shall be the duty of the Clerks of the Peace in the feveral counties, upon fuch appointments being made forthwith to fend lifts thereof to the Clerka of the respective towns or parishes in such counties, and such Clerks of each town or parish shall within twenty days after receiving the lift of fuch appointment give notice of the same.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners or the major part of them in the respective towns or parishes for which they shall be appointed Commissioners are hereby impowered and authorised to lay out such public highways and roads as they or the major part of them shall think most convenient as well for travellers as for the Inhabitants of each town or parish and the next adjacent towns, villages and neighbourhoods. and also to regulate the roads already laid out, and if any of them shall appear inconvenient and an alteration absolutely neceffary, and the same be certified upon oath by twelve difinterefted freeholders of the county in which such road lies, to be fummoned by the High Sheriff, his Deputy or any Constable of the county by virtue of a warrant to be iffued by two Justices of the Peace for that purpole on the application of twelve or more freeholders residing within the parish where the said road lies, then the faid Commissioners shall alter the same; and the faid Commissioners or the major part of them shall instead thereof lay out fuch other highways or roads as they judge most convenient to answer the purpose aforesaid, which highways and roads fo laid out shall be common highways; and the charge arising from fummoning fuch jury shall be paid by the persons applying to the faid Justices—PROVIDED ALWAYS. That nothing in this clause shall extend to prevent the Commissioners from altering any road with the consent of the Inhabitants of fuch parish without the necessity of sommoning such jury.

IV. And be it further enacted, That if any person or persons Persons, shering stopping, door shall hereafter, alter, stop up or incroach on any street, highway, or road already laid out, or that shall be hereafter laid on any fireet, out in pursuance of this act by laying timber, wood, carts, way to forfeit trucks or any things thereon, such person so offending contrary fence the sum of trucks or any things thereon, fuch person so offending contrary to the meaning of this act shall for every such offence forseit the fum of forty stillings to be recovered with costs of suit before any one Justice of the Peace upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses and levied by warrant directed to the Constable of the town or parish where such offence shall be committed by distraining the goods and chattels of the offenders, and where no such effects are to be found the offender or offenders to be imprisoned for fix days, or in case such offender shall not be known or found the same shall be recovered by the sale of so much of the timber, or wood, and the carts, trucks, or other things incumbering or stopping up the way in such road or street as aforesaid. And the said Constable after public notice is given by him of the felling fuch diffress shall make sale thereof and out of the produce shall pay the forfeitures and charges and return the overplus, if any there be, to the owner or owners thereof when found; which said forfeitures shall be applied by the Commissioners for and towards the repairing of the public roads or highways within the diffrict of the town or parish where the same may arise: And if the said nuisance shall continue the same shall be deemed a new offence, and shall be prosecuted and liable to the penalty afore-

er increaching forty billings.

V. And be it further enacted, That the width of all roads Width of hereafter to be laid out shall be left to the discretion of the more than 6x Commissioners for the time being of the town or parish where two Rodin fuch roads may be laid out, so that they do not exceed in breadth fix rods, and are not less than two rods.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the highways, roads Every male Inand bridges within each county shall be cleared, maintained, hastant, from the age of fixand repaired by the Inhabitants thereof; and that every male tren years and upwards (except as work fix days herein after mentioned) shall either in person or by an able bridges within fufficient man in his room in each and every year, provided with fuch necessary implements as shall be directed by the said Surveyors work fix days (allowing eight hours to each day's work) on the faid highways, roads, and bridges within the town or parish where they respectively dwell—PROVIDED Inhabitants be-ALW. one years of age, Apprentices and hired Servants shall be obliged. to work three days and no more, common Laborers and Journeymen Mechanics four days and no more—PROVIDED ALSO, That upon application to two of His MAJESTY's Justices of the Peace in the county, the said Justices shall and may in their differetion leffen the number of days labor to be performed by any aged or indigent Persons.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners in each town or parish for the time being shall by the first day of April in each and every year make out a list of the Inhabitants in such town or parish with the number of days work to be performed by each, and shall advertise the same at the most public place in such town or parish, and shall also furnish the Surveyor in their respective districts with a list of such Inhabitants and the number of days work fo to be done by each, and at the fame time shall direct the faid Surveyors at what places the work shall be done; which work shall be done by such Inhabitants under the direction of fuch Surveyors. And it shall further be the duty of the faid Commissioners to add to their list the names. of fuch persons as may come into their respective Parishes to refide after the first day of April unless they produce a certificate of their having performed their proportions of labor in some other town or parish.

Inhabitants may, in lien of fuch labor, pay lings and fixpence per day on or before the first day of June in every year, or three thillings per day after that time.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That if any Inhabitants in fuch lift prefer paying money to doing fuch labor, it shall and may be lawful for fuch Commissioners to take and receive from such Inhabitants the sum of two shillings and six pence per day for each day's labor required to be done by them, provided the fame is paid into the hands of the Commissioners on or before the first day of June in every year, and if such money is not paid until after that time they shall be obliged to pay three shillings per day or perform such labor. And the monies. which may be paid in lieu of fuch labor, as well as forfeitures which may be received by virtue of this act, shall be laid out under the direction of fuch Commissioners on such roads. streets, and bridges, between the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and accounted for by them to the Justices at their first General Sessions in every year.

Surveyers to fummon the Inhabitants, giving fix days notice in the fitteff

IX. And be it further enacted, That the Surveyors of Highways in their respective districts shall be and are hereby impowered in the fittest and most seasonable time between the time to labor, here the first day of May and the first day of November yearly to summon

the Inhabitants contained in their respective lists, giving them at the first day of May and the first day of least fize days notice of the time and place where they are to be November, employed, and shall their oversee and order the persons so summonea to laborin making, mending or repairing the highways, roads, streets and bridges in the most useful manner during the number of days appointed for each person to labor—and when and, if necessary any Surveyor of Highways shall judge the use of carts, waggons, trucks, ploughs or harrows more necessary then the plous or harlabor of men, in that case he may call on any person within which, with his district keeping any cart; truck, plough or harrow horses to be ewith two oxen or two horses; which cart, truck, plough labor, or harrow with two oxen or two horses shall be equal to two days labor; and fuch Surveyors of Highways shall be excused. from any other service on the Highways than the summoning, ordering and directing thereof.

X. And be it further enacted, That if any transient person Transient perunder the direction of such Surveyor shall neglect or refuse to work to be prowork, or shall not work in such a manner as to satisfy such creded against Surveyor, he is hereby impowered to dismiss such Inhabitant from them. the work and shall make complaint against him to some one of the Commissioners who shall immediately proceed against him in the same manner as is hereafter directed to be done to Inhabitants neglecting to work after being duly warned.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the Surveyors shall by Surveyors by the the first day of November in each and every year deliver in writing berto give in to to the Commissioners a list of such delinquents within their rethe Commissioners a list of spective districts as have, after being duly warned, neglected to delinquents, perform the whole or any part of the labor assigned to them respectively—and it shall be the Commissioners duty, within such delia-Justice of the Peace against every such delinquent which Justice form the labor shall on conviction adjudge every such delinquent to pay the three fillings fum of three shillings for every day he has so neglected to work, for every day's together with costs of suit, to be levied by warrant of distress and fale of fuch offender's goods and chattles under the hand and feal of fuch Justice, directed to any Constable in such town or parish, and in case no goods or chattles can be found it shall and may be lawful to commit such offender to the common Gaol of the county not exceeding fix days—PROVIDED AL-WAYS, That if any person shall produce a certificate from any Commissioner appointed by this act, that he has in the current year done his tour of labor in any parish in this province,

he shall be excused from doing such labor that year in any other parish.

Returns of highways to be made to the Clerks of the Peace and by them registered.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners for each town or parish for which they shall be appointed, shall from time to time enter in writing all the highways or roads laid out or altered and sign the same, and make a return thereof into the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county in which such highway or roads are laid out, to be by such Clerk entered in a book kept for that purpose, and whatsoever the said Commissioners shall do according to the powers given them in this act being so entered shall be valid and good to all intents and purposes whatsoever; and that every Commissioner who shall refuse or neglect to perform the duty enjoined and required of each of them as aforesaid, shall forseit and pay for every such refusal or neglect a sum not less than twenty shillings nor more than sive pounds to be recovered and applied as aforesaid.

Commissioners refusing or neglecting the duty enjoined them to forfeit not less than twenty shillings nor more than five pounds.

Commissioners, if on the oath of twelve free-holders it appear to be necessary, may lay out private roads

Owners of land through which private roads are laid out, to be paid the value thereof, to be effimated by agreement of the Parties, or by oath of the faid freeholders.

XIII. AND WHEREAS, it may be necessary to lay out private roads within the feveral counties in this province: Be it further enacted, That upon application to the Commissioners, appointed as aforefaid for any town or parish, for a private road, fuch Commissioners shall view the same, and if they are of opinion fuch road is absolutely necessary, and twelve principal freeholders to be summoned in manner aforesaid under oath shall be of the same opinion, the said Commissioners PROVIDED, are hereby impowered to lay out fuch road. That they shall not lay out such road through any person's land without the consent of the owner or owners thereof, or agreeing with and paying to him or them the value of the land fo to be laid out into fuch highway with fuch damages as he or they may fustain by the said road; and in case they cannot agree then the true value shall be set and appraised by the Justices of the Peace issuing such warrant as aforesaid for the summoning fuch freeholders and by the oath of the faid freeholders fo fummoned; and all the expenses and charges attending the faid road shall be paid by the person or persons applying for the and the faid road when laid out shall be for the only use of the person or persons who shall pay for the same, his and their heirs and affigns; but for no other use and purpose than that of a road—PROVIDED ALWAYS. That the owner or owners of the land through which such private road may be laid shall not be prevented from making use of fuch road if he shall fignify his intention of making use of the fame at the time when the jury are to ascertain the value of the

land and the damages by means of laying out fuch road-PROVIDED ALSO, That no such private road shall be laid out more than two rods wide against the consent of the owner or owners of the lands through which the same is to pals.

"XIV. And be it further enacted, That if any Public road Damages, cause hereafter to be laid out by virtue of this act, shall pass through roads passing any improved lands where the damage to the owner or owners through imof fuch lands by means of fuch road shall be greater than the to be estimated allowance made for roads in the Grants of such lands, which paid for as other shall be ascertained by a Jury to be summoned in the mancontingent

XV. XVI. And be it further enacted, That every person keeping a team shall be obliged forthwith on being summoned by the faid Surveyors to fend his team with a competent driver to work in such manner as the said Surveyors shall direct; and on any, fuch person, neglecting to send his team and a good driver

Teams, to be fent, as direct-ed by Surveyors with competent drivers, under penalty of fix shillings.

driver or not performing such reasonable work as the said Surveyors shall direct, the owner of the said team shall forseit the sum of six shillings.

Ways to be marked as directed by Commissioners.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That the faid way shall be marked in fuch place as the faid Commissioners. shall direct and with tops erected at the distance of not more than four rods: lengthways of the faid path from each other and five feet in heighth, and on any of the faid marks being displaced the Surveyors shall summon forthwith as many of the nearest Inhabitants with their teams as they may judge necessary to re-place them; and in case of refusal or neglect every person so offending shall forfeit the sum of three shillings for each man and fix shillings for each team for each day so summoned.—PRO-VIDED, when the public roads are on the bank of the river the faid path shall be marked on the river. The said fines and forfeitures to be recovered by complaint to a Justice of the Peace. as in case of refusal to labor on the highways and to be appropriated by the Commissioners towards performing the faid service. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the number of hours which any person shall work in pursuance of the directions of this clause shall be deducted from and allowed as a part of the number of hours he is obliged by law to work upon the highways.

Work done in purfuance of the directions in this claufe to be accounted as part of the work by law to be done on the roads.

Penalty of twenty shillings for cutting down or destroying such marks. XVIII. And be it further enacted, That if any person shall wilfully cut or take down or destroy any of the bushes so to be erected by virtue of this act, he shall forseit and pay the sum of twenty shillings upon conviction before any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses to be levied by warrant of distress and sale of the offenders goods, rendering the overplus if any, after deducting the costs and charges, to the offender; one half of the said forseiture to the use of the Poor of the town or parish where such offence shall be committed, the other moiety to him or them who shall inform and sue for the same; and for want of such effects to levy on, the said offender or offenders shall be imprisoned for a time not exceeding six days.

Winter reads to be broken in the fnow with teams &cc.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That the said Surveyors of the Highways by the direction of the Commissioners shall have full power and authority, and they are hereby required during the Winter season to summon such and so many of the Inhabitants having horses, oxen or teams in their respective diffricts as they in their discretion shall think sit, to work at the time

time and place appointed on the Highways or Public Winter Roads by breaking roads in the Snow with their faid horses, oxen, or teams whenever the depth of Snow shall render the same necessary not exceeding four days in each Winter and at no greater distance than three miles from their own houses. And such Inhabitants shall perform the same work over and above the work which fuch Inhabitants are liable to perform upon the highway, roads and bridges in and by this act.

XX. And be it further enacted, That all sleds made use of width of Steds for the purpose of carrying or transporting wood, hay, or to be four feet other heavy materials shall not be less than four feet eight inches from outside to in width from outlide to outlide of the runners; and wholoever runners. shall make use of any ox or horse sled of less demensions, and be thereof convicted by the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses before any of His MAJESTY's Justices of the Peace, or on the view of such Justice, shall be fined in the sum of twenty shillings; the same to be levied by distress and sale of the offender's goods and chattels by warrant under the hand and seal of fuch Justice rendering the overplus, if any, after deducting the costs and charges of such distress and sale, to the offender; which fines shall be paid and appropriated in like manner with the other penalties mentioned in this act. And it shall be the duty of all Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways and Constables in the respective parishes to prosecute all offences and breaches of this clause of the act-PROVIDED AL-WAYS, That nothing herein before contained shall be construed to extend to any sled a man may use upon his own farm only, or to any bob-fled, or fingle ox or horse fled, or pleasure fleigh drawn by one or more horses.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That no horse-sled or sleigh Sleighs or slede shall be drawn on the highways or public roads of this prowince unless the same shall be furnished with one or more bell less one bell for or bells for each horse drawing such sled or sleigh under the each horse. penalty of five shillings for every offence, to be recovered from the owner or driver thereof in the manner and to the uses last before mentioned.

XXII. And be it further enacted, That the respective Com- commissioners missioners of Highways shall at the first sitting of the Court of to give in accounts at the General Sessions of the Peace in the respective counties in each first fitting of year, deliver in to the Clerk of the Peace to be by him filed seffions of the in such Court the several and respective accounts of the labor done and money done on the highways so to be given them by the said Surveyors, received by vir-

tue of this act. and also an account with proper vouchers of all sums of money received by them for fines or forfeitures accruing by virtue or

this act and the purpose for which such sums shall have been expended; and if such sums or any part thereof remain in their hands they shall pay the same into the hands of the County Treasurer to be disposed of by the order of the Justices or the major part of them in their General Sessions for the making re-

Three pounds penalty for each neglect or refu-

district of the parish where such money was forseited—And if any Commissioner shall neglect or refuse to deliver in such accounts or any or either of them to the Clerk of the Peace as aforefaid, he shall forfeit and pay for every offence the sum of three pounds to be recovered before two Justices of the Peace in such county respectively to be paid into the hands of the Treasurer and applied in the manner herein before mentioned, and shall also be subject to an action of debt to be brought by and in the name of the Treasurer of such county for any sum so remaining in his hands.

Commissioners not required to work.

appointed by virtue of this act shall not be required to do any Surveyors to fue work on the highways, and that the Surveyors shall not be required to superintend the work more than fix days; and in all cases where additional Surveyors are wanted the Commissioners shall continue the Surveyors and pay them at the rate of three shillings per day out of the monies voluntarily paid into their hands or collected for fines by virtue of this act.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners

Porfecutions for penalties to be brought within fix months.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That no profecution or fuit for the recovery of any of the penalties mentioned in this act, shall be brought or instituted after the expiration of fix months from the time of committing the offence intended to be profecuted—PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS, That nothing in this act shall be construed to extend to prevent those intrusted with public monies by virtue of any of the herein before recited acts from being held accountable for all monies fo received by them.

Limitation.

XXV. And be it further enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force five years and no longer.
