## CAP. II.

An ACT to enable the Justices of the General Seffions of the Peace and Inferior Court of Common Pleas in the County of Northumberland, to hold the same for the present Year, at the times there-Passed the 16th March, 1803. in mentioned.

HEREAS from the absence of the Justices of the General Seffions of the Peace, and Inferior Courts of Common Pleas, Preamble. of the County of Northumberland, the faid Courts cannot be held on the first Tuesday in March, as heretofore accustomed.

- I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Courts to be holden Assembly, That the faid Courts shall be holden in this present year, on the Third Tuesday in March. on the third Tuesday in March.
- II. And be it further enacled, That no Writ or Process of any kind No Writ or Process whatever, shall abate or be discontinued by reason of the same to abate or be discon-Courts not being holden on the faid first Tuesday in March as afore- tinued by reason of the faid; but that all Writs and Processes which are returnable on the faid first Tuesday in March, shall be proceeded upon in the same manner as if the same were made returnable on the said third Tuesday in March. And that all other business of what nature or kind foever, which might or would have been done on the faid first Tuesday in March, shall and may be proceeded upon on the faid third Tuesday in March. Provided nevertheless, That nothing in this Act Terms not altered asshall be construed at any time after the present year to alter the time ter the present year. of holding the faid Courts, but the fame shall be held on the first Tuesday in March, and on the first Tuesday in August, in each year, as heretofore established.

## 3+0+3+0+3+0+c CAP. III.

An ACT for altering the Divisions of Four of the WARDS in the City of SAINT JOHN, and for changing the mode of Elections within the Two other WARDS of the faid City. Passed 16th March, 1803.

HEREAS fince the granting of the Charter of the City of Preamble. Saint John, by reason of the removal of many persons from fome of the Wards, the disproportion of Inhabitants in the several Wards, is at this time very great, and one of the Wards almost entirely depopulated: And whereas many of the Freemen and Inhabitants of the faid City, have by Petition, prayed that a remedy may be provided for the evil confequences arising from such changes.

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and WARDS divided by Assembly, That instead of the present division of the four Wards of lines drawn from the the faid City, on the Eastern side of the harbour, the same Wards be Harbour to the rear hereaster divided by lines drawn from the harbour to the rear of the faid City as follows, to wit, through the centre of King-street, Dukestreet, and Saint James and Stormont-street, and that all that part of the faid City lying to the Northward of King-street, be forever hereafter
