

CAP. VI.

An Act to enable the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief of this Province, for the time being, to suspend upon the contingency, and in the manner therein mentioned, the further operation of the Act, "for the encouragement of the Trade of this Province, in Plaster of Paris, or otherwise called Gypsum." Passed the 21th March, 1818.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That whensoever

When it shall be made known, that the Act of Nova-Scotia, has ceased to operate.

it shall appear and be made known to His Excellency, the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief of this Province, for the time being, that an Act made and passed in the Province of Nova-Scotia, for the encouragement of the Trade of that Province in Plaster of Paris, otherwise called Gypsum, shall have ceased to operate, and shall be no longer of force in that Province, it shall, and may be lawful for him, and he is hereby authorized and empowered by and with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Council, by Public Proclamation, to suspend the further operation and execution of the Act made and passed in the Fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign intituled, "an Act for the encouragement of the Trade of this Province in Plaster of Paris, otherwise called Gypsum," until His Majesty's Royal Pleasure shall be signified respecting the same.

The Governor with the advice and consent of the Council, may by Proclamation, suspend the Act of this Province, until His Majesty's pleasure is signified.
