shall be committed, forfeit each and every barrel of fish so offered for sale not inspected and marked as aforesaid; one half thereof to be given to the Informer, and the other half to the Overseers of the Poor of the Town or Parish where such offence shall be committed, to be applied to the use of the Poor.

Limitation

II. And be it further enacted; That this Act shall be, and is hereby declared to be in force and effect for and during the continuance of the herein before recited Acts, and no longer.

## CAP. XIII.

An ACT to repeal an Act intituled " An Act for the further " increase of the Revenue of this Province," and " An Acc " in addition to an Act, intituled an Act for the further increase " of the Revenue of this Province."

Passed the 20th of March, 1826?

THEREAS it is expedient that an Act made and passed in the sixtieth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for the "further increase of the Revenue of this " Province," and " An Act in addition to an "Act, intituled an Act for the further in-" crease of the Revenue of this Province," made and passed in the sixtieth year of the same Reign, should be repealed---

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, That the same Acts be, and they are hereby repealed, Saving the right saving the right of recovery of any penalties or recovery of peralties and forfeitures inflicted and incurred under and by virtue of the provisions of the same.
