An Act to explain an Act, intituled An Act for the more summary Punishment of Persons guilty of maliciously killing, maining, disfiguring or otherwise injuring Callle.

Passed 19th March 1833.

Preamble.

10 & 11 G. 4, c. 22.

Justices may tax and award Costs on Convictions had or to be had under 10 & 11 G. 4, e. 22. WHEREAS Doubts have arisen whether Persons convicted under the Act made and passed in the Tenth and Eleventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for more summary Punishment of Persons guilty of maliciously killing, maining, disfiguring or otherwise injuring Cattle, are liable for the Costs of Prosecution; For Remedy whereof,

Be it declared and enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That in all Cases of Convictions already had or which hereafter may be had before any Justices of the Peace, against any Person, under and by virtue of said Act, it is and shall be lawful for such Justices to tax and award Costs of the Prosecution for suchConviction agreeably to the Scale established by the Act now in Force for the Recovery of small Debts, and to issue Execution therefor together with the Damages assessed by such Justice.

CAP. XXXIV.

An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the County of Charlotte to assess the Inhabitants of Saint Stephen in the said County for the Purpose therein mentioned.

Passed 19th March 1833.

Justices in Session may assess the Inhabitants of Saint Stephen not exceeding £90 to pay Purchase of reserved Land at Milltown.

E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That the Justices of the Peace for the said County, at any General Sessions of the Peace hereafter to be holden, or the major Part of them, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make a Rate and Assessment on the Inhabitants of Saint Stephen in the said County of Charlotte, of any Sum not exceeding
