Charter, Grant or Public Instrument to be done or performed by, to or with His Majesty's Council in this Province, or by, to or with any member or members of His Majesty's Council, without specifying the Legislative Council, shall be deemed to be required to be done and performed by, to or with the Executive Council of the said Province, or any member or members thereof, as the case may be; excepting only such matters and things as belong to the Legislative Council, or the members thereof, as a branch of the Legislature of the said Province.

CAP. XVII.

· An Act to declare all Acts of Assembly to be public Acts.

Passed 17th March 1835.

HEREAS in this Province all Acts of the General Assembly are 'enrolled and printed and published in the same manner, whether ' they be in their nature public or private, and it is therefore expedient that ' they should all be deemed public Acts;'

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That every Act of the General Assembly of this Province heretolore made and passed, or which hereafter may be made and passed, shall be deemed and taken to a public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices and others without being specially pleaded, although it may concern only particular things or persons; unless in cases where the Act itself may expressly specify the contrary.

CAP. XVIII.

An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to repeal the Laws now in force for appointing Firewards and the hetter extinguishing of Fires, so far as the same relate to the Town of Fredericton, and to make regulations more suitable to the said Town," and an Act, intituled "An Act to extend the power of the Firewards in the Parish of Fredericton, and to make further regulations for the better extinguishing of Fires that inay happen in the said Parish."

Passed 17th March 1835.

That an Act made and passed in the fifth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to repeal the Laws now in force for appointing Firewards and the better extinguishing of Eires, so far as the same relate to the Town of Fredericton, and to make regulations more suitable to the said Town," and an Act made and passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to extend the power of the Firewards in the Parish of Fredericton, and to make further regulations for the better extinguishing of Fires that may happen in the said Parish," he and are hereby continued and declared to be in full force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven.

CAP. XIX.

An Act to erect the South-Western part of the Parish of Richibucto into a separate and distinct Parish,

Passed 17th March 1835.

HEREAS from the great extent of the Parish of Richibucto, and Y 'the increased population, render it inconvenient and difficult ' for the Parochiai officers to perform the several duties required of them; ' and it is therefore expedient that the same be divided into two Parishes;"
