To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, the sum of one handred pounds, for blowing Rocks in the Hagaguadavie River below the Forks so called.

- To Daniel Jouett, the sum of twenty seven pounds ten ghillings; towards remunerating him for erecting a Bridge across the Mactaquack.

That ihe sum offorty pounds granted in the year ons thousand eight hundred and twenty fours and raceived in the vear one thousand eight hundred and twenty five by George West, Esquire, the Commissionar for repairing the Bridge across Long's Creek in the County of York be re-approprinted and expended in erecting a Bridge over Kelly's Creek in the same County; the above sum having been paid back into the Treasury by tho said Commissioner.
II. And be it enacted; That the said several and respective sums of money and every part thereol, shall be paid to the several and respective persons who shall actually work and labour in makings completing and repairing.the said several Roads and Bridges, or in fusnishing materials therefor, at the most reasonable rates that such labour and materials can be proi vided; and the several and respecive persons who shall be intrusted with -the expenditure of the said several and respective sums, shall give due no-

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tice by Pablic Anction, excepting where the gituation of the Roads are such that in the opinion of the Supervisor or Commissioner it would be advisable that the work should be done by the day, in soch case they are hereby authorised to axpend one quarier. part of the several sums eo-intrusted to them by daye ${ }^{2}$ work; and the said Supervisor or Commissioner - shall keep, an exact account of the expenditure theleof; and shall produce receipts in writing from the several and respective persons to whom any part of the said money shall he paid, as Vouchers for suchi payments, and jender an account thereo! opon oath, (which oath any Justice of the Peace in the several and respective Counties is hereby authorised to administer, to be transmitted to the Secretary's Office to be laid before the General Assembly at the next Session; and such persons intrusted with the expenditure of the several and respectivesums of mòney shalistand charged and clíargeable with all sums intrusted to them and not accounted for as aforesaid, and shall repay the same into the Province Treasury.
III. And be it enacted, That all the before mentroned sums of money shall be paid by the I'reasurer out of the monies in the I'reasurgior as payment may be made at thẹ same, by Warrants of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Executive Council, Ior which Warrants no fee or deduction shall be demanded or taken from the persons in whose favor they may be issued.

1Y. And be it enacted, 'That the said Commissioners or person intrusted with the expenditure of the said several and respective sums of moxey shall for their time and trouble be allowed to retain at and alter the rate of five per centum ont ol the said sums so intrusted in them respectively, together with a reasonable compensation for actual work and labour periormed by them on the said several Roads and Bridges.

CAP. IV.
An Aet to authorise the Rectora. Church Wardens and Veatry of All Saints' Church in the Parish of Saint Anärews in the Conaty of Chatlotte, to sell and dispose of certain Land in the said Parish.

Passed 94lh June 1885.

WHEREAS the Rector, Church Wrasdens and Yeatry of All. Saints' Church in the Parish of Saint Aadrews in the County of Charlotte, are now soized and possessed of a certain Lot of Land situate and being in the Parish aforasaid, known and distinguished as Lot number eight in Block latter K, Parr's division, in ths Town Plat of Saint Andrews aforesaid, on which said Lot is the Parsonage House of ths anid Parish: And Finereas the asid Parsonsge. 'House is in a delapidated atate, and the said Reclor, Church Wrardens and Vestry are desirous to sell and dispose of the said Lot of Land abore'described with the Buildings thereon, and to apply tho procaeds thereof towards the erection of a nev Parsonage House for the said Parish:

- I. Be it therefore onactedty the Lientenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, That the said Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of All Saints' Cturch in the Parish of Saint Andrews, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to make sale and dispose of the said-Lot of Land aud promizes with the appurtenances, or any part or parts thereof, and thereapon to make aud execute good legal and sufficient conveyances of tha saino in fee, any former Lavi to the contrary notrithstaiding: Provided alpraye; that no sale and diapositron of the gaid Loit of Land and premises of of any part
