

CAP. XXI.

An Act to continue an Act in addition to an Act, intituled "An Act to repeal all the Laws now in force for the organization and regulation of the Militia and to make further provisions for the same." 1 Vict. c. 1.

Passed 25th March 1840.

**B**E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the first year of the Reign of her present Majesty, intituled "An Act in addition to an Act, intituled 'An Act to repeal all the Laws now in force for the organization and regulation of the Militia and to make further provisions for the same,' " be and the same is hereby continued and declared to be in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five. 1 Vict. c. 1, continued.

CAP. XXII.

An Act to continue an Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the County of York to make further provision for the payment of the Treasurer of that County.

Passed 25th March 1840.

**B**E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the sixth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the County of York to make further provision for the payment of the Treasurer of that County," be and the same is hereby continued and declared to be in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five. 6 W. 4, c. 16, continued.

CAP. XXIII.

An Act to authorize the Grand Jurors of the several Counties within this Province to inspect the Public Accounts.

Passed 25th March 1840.

**I. B**E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That once in each year at the General Sessions of the Peace in each County in this Province, next succeeding the General Sessions at which Parish Officers are appointed, it shall be the duty of the Justices to cause a full, particular and detailed account of all the receipts and expenditures of public monies within such County for the past year, to be laid before the Grand Jury for their inspection and examination; and such Grand Jury may make such representation and presentment to the Court thereupon as to them shall seem meet. Accounts of public monies to be laid annually before the Grand Jury, who may make presentments thereupon.

**II.** Provided always and be it further enacted, That in the County of Charlotte the said detailed account shall be laid before the Grand Jury at the General Sessions of the Peace at which Parish Officers are appointed on or before the second day of the said Sessions. At what Term to be submitted in Charlotte County.

**III.** And be it enacted, That this Act shall continue and be, in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five. Limitation.
