CAP. II.

An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the County of Kent to levy an assessment to defray the contingent expenses of the County.

Passed 25th March 1844.

DE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assem-Justices authorized bly, That the Justices of the Peage for the County of Kent be and they coding £100, to are hereby authorized and empowered, a cany General Sessions of the Peace, or at any Special Sessions to be for that purpose holden, to levy an assessment upon the County. the Inhabitants of the said County, not exceeding one hundred and twenty pounds, to defray the necessary contingent expenses of the County; such sum to be assessed and collected under and by virtue of any Acts in force for the assessingand collecting of County or Parish Rates.

CAPLIII.

An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the County of Charlotte to make further provision for the payment of the Treasurer of that County.

Passed 25th March 1844.

THEREAS by the Laws new in force, the Sessions of the respective Preamble. 'Counties in this Province are precluded from allowing to the County 'Treasurers respectively, for their services, per annum, any sum exceeding fifteen pounds, which in the County of Charlotte has been found a very inade-quate compensation for the services addresponsibility of that Officer;'

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Justices in General Assembly, That the Justices of the Peace for the said County, or the major part to grant additional of them, at any General Sessions to be holden in and for the said County, are the Treasurer. hereby fully authorized and empowered to make such additional compensation to the said Treasurer of that County, as they in their discretion may deem right and proper, not exceeding the sum of twenty five pounds per annum, to be paid out of the contingent fund of the said County.
