Passed 27th March 1845.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Home Government has recently caused a Preamble.

'Survey to be made for a new line of Military Road to be carried ' from Halifax through this Province to Quebec, and has intimated an intention

' to make and complete the same under the directions and superintendence of 'Officers to be appointed by Her Majesty's Board of Ordnance, at the expense

of the Imperial Funds to be provided for that purpose: And whereas it is ' deemed expedient to afford every facility to the Officers that may be so employed

' in the finally settling and laying out the line of the said Military Road, so far as

' the same extends through this Province, and in the opening, making and com-

' pleting of the same;'

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council so much of the and Assembly, That so much of the said line of the said Military Road, when Halifax to Quebec finally determined on by the Officers of Her Majesty's Service appointed to suras lies within this
Province as lies within this
Province, as hereby declared to a Province and made one of the Great Roads of this Province; and the Lieutenant Governor
Great Road. and made one of the Great Roads of this Province; and the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Province for the time being, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Executive Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to declare such Officer or Officers of Her Majesty's

Service.
