CAP. XI.

An Act relating to the Navigation of the River and Harbour of Saint John.

Passed 30th April 1851.

THEREAS by the operation of an Act, intituled An Act in addition to Preamble. ' and in amendment of the Act relating to the Navigation of the River and 12 V. c. 52. ' Harbour of Saint John, and An Act for more effectually securing the Navigation 1 V. c. 37.

' of the River and Harbour of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, it

is rendered unlawful to put, place or throw into the Harbour of the City of 'Saint John any slabs, edgings, rinds, bark, chips or sawdust: And whereas it

'appearing from the situation of the "Carleton Tide Mills," that they cannot be ' worked without the sawdust falling into the tide, and that the operation of the

' said Acts would be ruinous to the Lessee of the said Mills;'

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Carleton Mülis Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act the "Carleton Tide Mills" exempted from the operation of shall be exempt from the operation of the Act, intituled An Act in addition to and 7 V. c. 52, and in amendment of the Act relating to the Navigation of the River and Harbour of Saint John, and An Act for more effectually securing the Navigation of the River and Harbour of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, so far as the same relate to sawdust.
