Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and After 5th July Assembly, That from and after the fifth day of July next, no money charge or be charged on rate of Postage whatever shall be made or exacted for the transmission through Newspapers, or or delivery by any Post Office in this Province now established or hereafter to be Tracts of less than two ounces in established, of any Newspaper or Newspapers, or of any Pamphlets or Tracts of weight. less than two ounces in weight, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding; provided nevertheless, that the condition of such free transmission and delivery shall in all respects be subject and according to the provisions of the fourteenth section of an Act made and passed in the thirteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act for the establishment and regulation of Inland Posts within this Province.

CAP. XXVIII.

An Act to revive and continue an Act to alter and amend the Act to regulate Sales by Public Auction.

DE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, Act 10 V. c 53, That an Act made and passed in the tenth year of the Reign of Her present tinued till let May Majesty, intituled An Act to alter and amend the Act to regulate Sales by Public 1856. Auction, be and the same is hereby revived, continued and declared to be in full force until the first day of May which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six.

An Act to amend an Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Local Government of Counties, Towns, and Parishes.

DE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, General Sessions D That in addition to the powers conferred upon the General Sessions by the make and enforce first article of the tenth section of an Act to consolidate and amend the Laws regulations for relating to the Local Government of Counties, Towns and Parishes within this roads, and the Province, the General Sessions shall have full power and authority from time to shafts to sleds, time to make, revise, alter, amend and enforce all such rules as may be deemed sleighs, &c. necessary and proper for certain Districts, or the whole of the respective Counties, as the case may be, for the following purposes, namely, for breaking and keeping open snow roads in winter, and regulating the manner and mode of attaching shafts to, and driving of any sled, sleigh, pung, or any other description of vehicle, with one or more horse or horses, and to impose such fines and penalties as may be deemed necessary for the non-observance or breach thereof, not to exceed the sum of ten pounds, and to be recovered and applied in like manner as prescribed in and by the hereinbefore recited Act.
