CAP. XXXVIII.

An Act to provide for opening and repairing Roads and erecting Bridges throughout the Province. Passed 7th April 1852.

B E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows :—

1. There shall be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the Province to such persons as His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being shall appoint, in addition to the sums already granted, the following for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :---

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Govern-Money granted for ment for the time being, the following sums for the Great and other Roads, for viz: building and repairing Bridges, and for opening and improving Roads to and in new Settlements, viz :-

One thousand four hundred pounds from Saint John to Nova Scotia Line; St. John to Nova Scotia. six hundred pounds of this sum to be expended between Saint John and Hayward's Mills; fifty pounds on the old Westmorland Road, from the Cemetery towards and past Tisdale's farm house; fifty pounds on the old Westmorland Road, in King's County; and the remainder, seven hundred pounds, from Hayward's Mills to the Nova Scotia Line; twenty pounds of which to be expended on the Aboideau over Fox Creek; and such sum as the Supervisor may find necessary to be paid the Commissioners of Sewers, in part towards keeping the Aboideau over the AuLac in repair; and such part of the said Grant to be expended on the old Tantamar Road as may be found necessary to keep the same in repair.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Govern- Sunbury County Bye Roads. ment for the time being, the sum of seven hundred and sixty pounds for the several Bye Roads in the County of Sunbury, to be applied and expended agreeably to a Resolution of the House of Assembly passed on the fifth day of April in the present year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two, and concurred in by the Legislative Council.

2. The said several and respective sums of money and every part thereof, shall Money to be be expended under the direction of such Supervisors and Commissioners as His the direction of Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the Supervisor and time being, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, may be pleased to appointed by the Governor in appoint; and shall be paid to the several and respective persons who shall Council. actually work and labour in making, completing and repairing the several Roads and Bridges, or in furnishing materials therefor, at the most reasonable rates that such labour and materials can be provided ; and every Commissioner so to be Duty of Commisappointed shall as early in the season as may be, carefully examine the part of ing the money. the Road where any sums of money are to be expended, and shall lay out and mark off such allotment or allotments as may conveniently be contracted for, in order that the making or repairing of the same may be let by auction to the lowest bidder; and in all such cases such Commissioners respectively are hereby required to put a sufficient number of notices not less than ten days previous to such sale in three or more of the public places in the neighbourhood where the work is to be done; which notice shall specify and describe the work to be performed, and also the place, day and hour, when and where the same will be let by auction as aforesaid; and it shall further be the duty of such Commissioners respectively, to attend personally at the time and place so appointed, and there to let out to the lowest bidder such allotment or allotments, and at the same time to enter into written contracts for the faithful performance of the work in time and manner set forth in such contracts; and in cases when the work required to be performed cannot be conveniently let at auction, it shall be the duty of said Commissioners to agree with fit and proper persons to perform the same by day's labour, provided that in no case shall more than one quarter part of any Grant be so expended; and the said Commissioners shall severally keep an exact Accounty to be account of such moneys, and shall produce receipts in writing of the several and rendered in dupkrespective persons to whom any part of the said money shall be paid, as vouchers of such payments, and render an account thereof in duplicate, upon oath, (which oath any one of the Justices of the Peace in the several Counties is hereby authorized to administer,) one copy of which, with vouchers, to be transmitted to the Secretary's Office on or before the first day of December next, to be laid before the General Assembly at the next Session, and the other copy to be filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace in the respective Counties for public information.

3. The before mentioned sums of money shall be paid by the Treasurer out Money to be paid of the moneys in the Treasury, or as payment may be made at the same, by Warrant. 4. The said Commissioners entrusted with the expenditure of the said several and respective sums of money, shall for their time and labour be allowed to retain at and after the rate of five per centum out of the said money so entrusted to them respectively, together with a reasonable compensation for actual labour and work performed by them on the said several Roads and Bridges.

5. The said Commissioners shall expend the said several and respective sums expended on or before the first day of Money on the Roads on or before the first day of October; provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prevent any Commissioner from expending moneys after the first day of October, when it shall be necessary to expend the same for building Bridges, removing rocks, stumps, trees or other obstructions.

6. None of the before mentioned sums of money, or any part thereof, shall be laid out or expended in the making or improving any alteration that may be made in any of the said Roads, unless such alterations shall have been first laid out and recorded.

7. All persons who may be appointed Commissioners for the expenditure of money hereinbefore granted, and before entering upon the duties of his office, shall respectively enter into a Bond to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, to the satisfaction of the Executive Government, for the due performing his duty as such Commissioner, and the faithful expenditure of and due accounting for such moneys as shall come into his hands as such Commissioner.

CAP. XXXIX.

An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned.

Passed 7th April 1852.

E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows :-

1. There be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this Province the following sums, to-wit :-

To Catherine W. Chamberlain, of Saint John, the sum of twenty pounds for teaching in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty one a Female School of a superior description in that City.

To Edward H. Duval, Teacher of the British School in Saint John, the sum of one hundred pounds towards the support of that institution.

To William Heron the sum of fifteen pounds to reimburse him for labour performed on the Road leading from Fredericton to Miramichi.

To the Trustees of the Wesleyan Academy, at Mount Allison, Sackville, the sum of three hundred pounds towards the support of that institution.

To William Fitzgerald the sum of eighty pounds for extra materials and labour on the Bridge across the Richibucto River, in full for his claim.

To the Managing Committee of the Baptist Seminary in Fredericton the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds towards the support of that institution.

To the Governor and Trustees of the Madras School the sum of four hundred pounds for the support of that institution.

To the Reverend William Henderson, Edward Williston, and William Falconer, Trustees of the Grammar School, Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings to enable them to pay John Sivewright a balance due him for teaching the said School, and in full for such service.

To John Thompson, of Miramichi, the sum of ninety one pounds due him for Medical
