CAP. II.

An Act to relieve certain Articles from the payment of Duty.

Section. 1.—Free importation of certain articles allowed.

Passed 3rd November 1854.

WHEREAS it is desirable to relieve certain Articles hereafter imported into this Province from the payment and collection of any duty or duties imposed by any Act or Acts now in force ;

1. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, the Articles hereinafter enumerated, shall and may be imported free from all duty, for and notwithstanding any Act or Law now in force to the contrary, that is to say :—Molasses, Grain, Flour, Meal, and Salted and Cured Meats of all kinds.

CAP. III.

An Act to enable a majority of the Rate payers upon Property to establish a Municipality in any County.

Section.

1. Parts of certain Acts repealed.
2. Preliminary meetings at each polling place.

Passed 3rd November 1854.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows :—

1. The first and second Sections of the forty second Chapter

of Title VI of the Revised Statutes, and so much of an Act made and passed in the seventeenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled *An Act to alter and amend the Act providing for the establishment of Municipal Authorities in this Province*, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed; but all the other provisions of the said recited Act shall remain in force.

2. When there are several polling places in a Parish, a meeting to consider the propriety of incorporating any County shall be held at each polling place, and the Sheriff shall prescribe the place the Town Clerk shall attend, being the nearest to his residence, and appoint a fit person to attend any other place.

3. The Collector of Rates shall furnish the list required by the fifth Section of the said recited Act for every polling district in the Parish, in the manner and subject to the penalties mentioned in the said Section.

4. If a majority of the Rate payers upon Property in the County vote for the Incorporation, the Sheriff shall certify the same to the Governor in Council, who shall grant a Charter therefor.

CAP. IV.

An Act to provide for the Expenses of the Legislature.

Section.

1. Vote to President of Legislative Council;
2. To the Members;
3. To Speaker of the Assembly;
4. To the Members;

Section.

5. For travelling expenses;
6. Money to be drawn by Warrant.
7. Limitation of Act.

Passed 3rd November 1854.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows :—

1. That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the Province to the President of the Legislative Council the sum of fifty pounds for the present Session of the General Assembly, and the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds for each and every future Session of the General Assembly.

2. That there be allowed and paid out of the said Treasury to each and every Member of the Legislative Council, for defraying the expenses of attending in General Assembly, the sum of twenty shillings per diem for the attendance of the Legislative Council, to be certified by the President thereof.
