

Passed 12th April 1855.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to sell certain lands in the Parish of Saint David, granted to the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint David's Church, in the said Parish, and invest the proceeds arising from such sale in the purchase of other lands more convenient and beneficial for a Glebe for the use of the Rector;—

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint David's Church, in the Parish of Saint David, in the County of Charlotte, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, by and with the sanction and consent of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, to sell, dispose of, and convey all and singular the said lands, and execute good and sufficient deeds of the same in fee simple to the purchasers.

2. The amount arising from such sale shall be invested by the said Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, in the purchase of other freehold lands, more conveniently situated for the use and benefit of the Rector or Minister of the said Church for the time being as a Glebe.

CAP. LIX.

An Act to authorize the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Saint Mary, in the County of York, to sell certain lands, and to vest the proceeds in other lands.

1. Sale of lands belonging to Saint Mary's Church in Saint Mary, authorized.

2. Proceeds to be reinvested in Glebe.

WHEREAS the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Saint Mary, in the County of York, are now seized and possessed of certain lots or tracts of land in said Parish and County, described in the original Grant in substance as follows:—The first tract beginning at a marked hemlock tree standing at the intersection of the southern boundary line of lot number twelve, granted to George Dunbar in the Grant to Daniel Lyman and others, with the eastern bank or shore of the Nashwaak River, and at the southwest angle of

the east part of the aforesaid Grant to George Dunbar, thence by the magnetic needle along the southern boundary line of the east part of the said Grant to George Dunbar, south eighty eight degrees east one hundred and nine chains, of four poles each, and fifty links, to a marked spruce tree; thence south seven degrees west twenty nine chains and fifty links, to the north-east angle of the east part of lot number ten, granted to William French; thence along the northern boundary line of the east part of the said Grant to William French, north eighty eight degrees west one hundred and three chains and fifty links, to the eastern bank or shore of the Nashwaak River aforesaid, and a marked stake placed thereon, and thence along the said bank or shore up stream in a northerly direction to the place of beginning: Also that tract of land contained in the same Grant as the piece above described, and therein mentioned as the fourth tract, beginning at a marked birch tree standing at the intersection of the northern boundary line of lot number ten of the aforesaid Grant to William French, with the western bank or shore of the Nashwaak River aforesaid, and at the northeast angle of the west part of the said Grant to William French; thence along the northern boundary line of the west part of the said Grant to William French, north eighty eight degrees west one hundred and fifteen chains and fifty links; thence north seven degrees east twenty nine chains and fifty links, to the southwest angle of the west part of the aforesaid Grant to George Dunbar; thence along the northern boundary line of the west part of the said Grant to George Dunbar, south eighty eight degrees east one hundred and ten chains and fifty links, to the western bank or shore of the Nashwaak River aforesaid, and a marked spruce tree standing thereon, and thence along the said bank or shore down stream in a southerly direction to the place of beginning: Which said tracts of land were granted to the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of said Church, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of this Province, bearing date the twenty first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven;—

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That the said Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Saint Mary, in the

County of York, by and with the approbation of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of all or any of the said Glebe Lands described in the Preamble, and to make good and sufficient deeds of conveyance of the same.

2. That the amounts arising from such sale shall be reinvested by the said Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, in the purchase of other lands for the purposes of a Glebe for said Church.

CAP. LX.

An Act to authorize the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Christ Church, in the Parish of Fredericton, to sell certain lands, and reinvest the proceeds thereof.

1. Sale of certain lands belonging to Christ Church, Fredericton, authorized.

2. Proceeds to be reinvested.

WHEREAS the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Christ Church, in the Parish of Fredericton, are seized and possessed of a certain tract of land situate in the Parish of Kingsclear, in the County of York, containing about thirty acres, conveyed to them by the Honorable Thomas Baillie, by deed bearing date the thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, for the use and purpose of a Glebe for the said Parish of Fredericton; and also of a certain other tract of land situate in the Parish of Fredericton, containing about three hundred and fifty acres, being part of a lot or tract of five hundred acres heretofore granted by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of this Province, and bearing date the ninth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine, to them the said Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, as a Glebe for the use of the Rector or Minister of the said Parish for the time being: And whereas it is considered expedient and for the benefit of the Rector or Minister of the said Parish, that the said Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry should be authorized to sell and dispose of the said two tracts of land;—

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—
