31 George III – Chapter 11

**An Act for the Security and Protection of Certain Islands in the River Saint John.**

- I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, That it shall and may be lawful for the Justices of the General Sessions of the Peace in the county of York, upon the application of the Grand Jury, if such Justices or the major part of them shall think fit, to declare, by any order or orders for that purpose to be made, that the waters surrounding the Islands lying in the river Saint John above the town of Fredericton, shall be a lawful fence. And upon public notice being given by affixing such order or orders in the most public places in each town or parish in the said county the water so declared to be a lawful fence, shall from thenceforth be deemed and taken to be a lawful fence, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.
- II. And be it further enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force two years and no longer.
