34 George III – Chapter 5

**An Act to Alter and Amend an Act, intituled “An Act for regulating Inn-Holders, Tavern-Keepers and Retailers of Spirituous Liquors.”**

Whereas, in and by an act made and pasted in the twenty sixth year of His Majesty's reign intituled “An Act for regulating Inn-holders, Tavern-keepers and Retailers of Spirituous Liquors” it is enacted “That no Retailer, Inn-holder, Tavern or Ale-house-keeper who shall sell upon trust or credit any Wine, Strong-beer, Ale, Brandy, Rum or other Spirituous Liquors mixt or un-mixt to any Soldier, Sailor, Servant or other Person whatsoever, to the amount of any sum exceeding the sum of five shillings, shall have any remedy to recover the same either at law or in equity, against any of the persons aforesaid, their Executors or Administrators.”

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That nothing in the said recited act shall be construed to extend to prevent any Retailer, not being an Ale-house-keeper, Tavern-keeper or Inn-holder, from selling on credit to any person or persons not being Soldiers, Sailors, or Servants, or shall debar such Retailer from a legal recovery, any thing in the said act to the contrary notwithstanding.
