45 George III – Chapter 9

An Act in Addition to an Act, intituled, "An Act for Regulating Juries and Declaring the Qualification of Jurors." Passed the 5th of March, 1805.

Whereas in and by an Act made and passed in the Twenty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating Juries and declaring the qualifications of Jurors," no provision is made respecting the Fees to be paid to Jurymen returned to serve on special Juries under the authority of the said Act.

Be it therefore enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, That any person who shall after the first day of May next serve upon any special Jury appointed or returned by authority of the said Act, shall be allowed to take for serving on such Jury no more than the sum of money which the Judge who tries the issue or issues shall think just and reasonable, not exceeding the sum of Five Shillings per day, and that the Sheriff for summoning and returning such Jury shall be intitled to receive a sum not exceeding Thirty Shillings, to be taxed at the discretion of the Judges.
