50 George III – Chapter 13

An Act to continue and amend an Act, intituled an Act for regulating Pilots. Passed the 14th of March, 1810.

Whereas it has been found that several Pilots appointed by virtue of an Act, made and passed in the twenty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating Pilots," have refused or neglected to perform the duties required of them by said Act. And whereas no power is given by said Act, to remove or displace such Pilots as may refuse or neglect to perform the duties required of them in and by said Act.

I. Be it therefore enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, That it shall and may be lawful for the Justices of the Common Pleas, in such Counties where Pilots are, or may be appointed, on complaint and proof before them, that any Pilot has neglected or refused to perform the duties required of as a Branch Pilot, by virtue of said Act, to displace and remove any Pilot so convicted of neglect or refusal, and to declare him prohibited and restrained from exercising the duties of a Pilot for the Port or place to which he was appointed a Pilot.

II. An be it further enacted, That the said Act, and every part thereof, not hereby altered and amended, be and remain in full force and virtue, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
