

Acts of the General Assembly of His Majesty's Province of New-Brunswick passed in the year 1820. Fredericton, NB: George K. Lugin, Printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty, 1820.

60 George III – Chapter 4

An Act to continue several Acts of the General Assembly that are near expiring. Passed the 20th of March 1820.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the thirty-ninth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Fisheries in the County of Northumberland": also an Act made and passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the better regulation of Licences to Inns, Taverns, and Houses for selling strong Liquors by retail": also another Act made and passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower and authorize the Justices of the County of Westmorland, at their General Sessions of the Peace, to regulate the grazing and depasturing of the several Marshes, Lowlands, or Meadows, within the said County": also an Act made and passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act in amendment of an Act, intituled an Act for regulating the Fisheries in the County of Northumberland": also another Act made and passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act more effectually to provide for the support of a Nightly Watch in the City of Saint John": also another Act made and passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to encourage the establishment of Schools in this Province": also an Act made and passed in the fifty eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act in addition to and in amendment of an Act, intituled an Act to encourage the establishment of Schools in this Province": and also another Act made and passed in the fifty-eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the inspection of Fish for home consumption" — be, and the same Acts are hereby declared to be continued and in full force for three years, and thence to the end of the then next Session of the General Assembly.
