60 George III – Chapter 9

An Act to provide for the cancelling the Treasury Notes that have been issued in this Province. Passed the 22nd of March 1820.

Whereas the greater part of the Notes which have been issued pursuant to an Act made in the fifty-eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to provide for punctuality of payment at the Treasury," are now in the Treasury, and it is expedient that the remainder should also be called in and cancelled—

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, That all the Notes now in the Treasury, amounting to eight thousand one hundred and forty-nine Pounds, five Shillings, be cancelled by the Treasurer, on or before the first day of June next ensuing, in the presence of the Hon. Ward Chipman, Hugh Johnston, and John Ward, Esquires, or any two of them, who shall give to the Treasurer a certificate of die number and amount of the notes so cancelled.

II. And be it further enacted, That the Treasurer shall within one month after the passing of this Act, by advertisement in the Royal Gazette, call upon all persons holding any of the Treasury notes now outstanding, to bring in the same, on or before the first day of October next, and receive payment thereof, either in money or in a note or notes, in part of the loan authorized by an Act made and passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable the Province Treasurer to borrow the sum of nine thousand Pounds, for paying off bounties and other debts payable by the Laws of this Province."

III. And be it further enacted, That the Treasury notes so brought in, shall be cancelled by the Treasurer, in the presence of the persons named in the first section of this Act, or any two of them, who shall give to the Treasurer a certificate of the number and amount of the notes so cancelled.
