## An Act to continue and amend the Acts for raising a Revenue in this Province. Passed the 17th of March 1825.

I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the third year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for raising a Revenue in this Province," and since continued to the first day of April next, and also an Act made and passed in the fifth year of the same Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue and amend an Act intituled, 'an Act for raising a Revenue in this Province," be and the same are hereby further continued (except where the same are hereby amended and altered) and declared to be in full force together with this Act, until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after the first day of April next, there be, and is hereby granted to the King's most Excellent Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, for the use of the Province, and for the support of the Government thereof, in lieu of the several duties on Wines, imposed in and by the first Section of the said first hereinbefore recited Act passed in the third year of the present Reign, the several rates and duties hereinafter mentioned on all Wines which shall or may be brought or imported into any port or place within this Province, and landed, to be paid by the importer thereof, over and above all duties that are now imposed by any Act or Acts of the Imperial Parliament, that is to say, For every gallon of Wine imported from any port in His Majesty's Dominions and landed, one shilling and three pence, and for every gallon of Wine imported from any Foreign Port or Place and landed, six pence.

III. And be it further enacted, That such parts of the fourteenth and fifteenth Sections of the said first hereinbefore recited Act, passed in the third year of the present Reign as refer to the drawback on Wines, be and the same are hereby repealed.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the duties by this Act imposed, shall be paid or secured, collected and recovered in and by the same manner and means, and under the same penalties and forfeitures as are provided in and by the said Act of the third year of the present Reign, intituled, "An Act for raising a Revenue in this Province," and the same powers are hereby given to the Treasurer and His Deputies and Tide Surveyors, for the collection thereof, and the same obligations imposed on the masters of vessels and owners of Wines as in and by the said Act are given and imposed.
