

Acts of the General Assembly of His Majesty's Province of New-Brunswick passed in the year 1826. Fredericton, NB: George K. Lugin, Printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty, 1826.

7 George IV – Chapter 27

An Act to impose a duty on Horse imported into this Province, and for other purposes. Passed the 7th of March 1826.

I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the first day of April next, there be and is hereby granted to the King's Most Excellent Majesty His Heirs and Successors for the use of this Province, and the support of the Government thereof, the sum of Five pounds upon each and every Horse, imported into this Province, to be paid by the importer or importers thereof.

II. And be it further enacted, That the above duty, and also all other rates and duties imposed upon any articles imported into this Province, by any Act made and passed during the present Session of the Legislature, or so much thereof as may remain to be collected after the duties imposed thereon, by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the United Kingdom, if any are paid to, or secured by the Officers of His Majesty's Customs, pursuant to the said Act of Parliament, shall be paid, levied, recovered or secured in the manner directed in and by an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for raising a Revenue in this Province," and subject to all the Rules, Regulations and Directions, and liable to all the pains, penalties and forfeitures in the said Act of Assembly contained.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue and be in force until the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and no longer.
