

Acts of the General Assembly of His Majesty's Province of New-Brunswick passed in the year 1828. Fredericton, NB: George K. Lugin, Printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty, 1828.

9 George IV – Chapter 14

An Act to extend the provisions of an Act, intituled “An Act to repeal the Laws now in force for appointing Fire Wards, and the better extinguishing of Fires, so far as the same relate to the Town of Fredericton; and to make regulations more suitable to the said Town,” to the Towns of Newcastle and Chatham, and their Vicinities, in the County of Northumberland. Passed 5th April, 1828.

Whereas the inhabitants of the Town of Newcastle and its Vicinity have purchased for the use of the said Town, a Fire Engine and various tools and implements for extinguishing Fires. And whereas the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the said County, have also purchased various tools and implements for extinguishing Fires. And whereas it is necessary that a sufficient number of prudent and discreet persons should be appointed as Firewards in each of the said Towns and their respective Vicinities. And whereas it is also necessary that a sufficient number of skilful persons should be appointed to have the care and management of the said Engine, tools and implements, and of any other that may from time to time be provided in each of the said Towns of Newcastle and Chatham.

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, an Act made and passed the 5th year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled “An Act to repeal the Laws now in force for appointing Firewards, and the better extinguishing of Fires, so far as the same relate to the Town of Fredericton, and to make regulations more suitable to the said Town,” and all the provisions thereof, be, and the same are hereby extended to the Towns of Newcastle and Chatham, in the County of Northumberland.
