9 George IV – Chapter 17

An Act to erect a part of the Parish of Hillsborough, in the County of Westmoreland, into a distinct Town or Parish. Passed 5th April, 1828.

I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant- Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the fifteenth day of November next, all that Tract of Land situate in the Parish of Hillsborough, commencing at the mouth of Stoney Creek, so called, and running from thence West until it shall intersect the Eastern side line, of the Township of Salisbury; thence running Northerly on the same until it meets the Petticodiack [Petitcodiac] River; and from thence following the same down Stream to the first mentioned Boundary, shall be known and distinguished by the name of the Parish of Coverdale.

II. And be it further enacted, That the Justices of the Peace from the said County shall, and they are hereby empowered annually at the General Sessions of the Peace held for said County, on the third Tuesday in November in each year, to appoint Town or Parish Officers for the said Parish of Coverdale, in like manner as for other Towns or Parishes in said County.
