1 William IV – Chapter 29

An Act to alter and amend an Act, intituled *An Act for preserving the Bank of the River Saint John in Front of the Parishes of Magerville [Maugerville], Sheffield and Waterborough*. Passed 31st March 1831.

Whereas by the first Section of an Act made and passed in the Thirty fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act for preserving the Bank of the River Saint John in Front of the Parishes of Magerville, Sheffield and Waterborough, it is enacted, among other Things, that it shall not be lawful for Neat Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Swine or Goats to be suffered to go at large in the Highway, or graze on the Bank of the River Saint John in Front of the Parish of Magerville, between the Tenth Day of March and the Tenth Day of November in each Year: And Whereas in consequence of an Alteration of the Highway in Front of the upper Part of the said Parish of Magerville, the same has been found inconvenient: For Remedy whereof,

Be it therefore enacted by the President, Council, and Assembly, That nothing in the said in part recited Section of the said Act shall be construed to extend to that Part of Magerville from where the present Highway leaves the River Saint John, in the Parish of Magerville aforesaid, and runs in the Rear to the County of York, to the upper boundary Line of the said Parish of Magerville.
