2 William IV – Chapter 4 Session 2

An Act to authorize and empower the Magistrates of the County of Charlotte to sell a certain Piece of Land in the Town of Saint Andrews, and to vest the Proceeds in purchasing another Piece of Land for the Purpose of erecting a County Gaol thereon in said Town. Passed 7th May 1832.

'Whereas the Magistrates of Charlotte County have purchased a Piece of Land in the Town Plat of Saint Andrews, known as Block Letter M. Bulkeley's Division, for the Purpose of erecting the County Gaol thereon: And Whereas it is deemed inexpedient to build the Gaol thereon: And Whereas another Piece of Land in the Town Plat of Saint Andrews more convenient and suitable for that Purpose can be purchased by said Magistrates;'

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, That the Magistrates of the County of Charlotte be and they are hereby authorized and empowered in any General or Special Sessions to be holden for that Purpose to sell that Piece or parcel of Land known (as by Reference to the Plan of the Town of Saint Andrews will more fully appear) as Block Letter M. in Bulkeley's Division in the Town Plat of Saint Andrews, and to appropriate the Monies derived from such Sale towards the Purchase of another Piece of Land in the Town Plat of Saint Andrews, on which to erect said County Gaol and towards the Expense of erecting the same.
