3 William IV – Chapter 33

An Act to explain an Act, intituled An Act for Ike more summary Punishment of Persons guilty of maliciously killing, maiming, disfiguring or otherwise injuring Cattle. Passed 19th March 1833.

Whereas Doubts have arisen whether Persons convicted under the Act made and passed in the Tenth and Eleventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for more summary Punishment of Persons guilty of maliciously killing, maiming, disfiguring or otherwise injuring Cattle, are liable for the Costs of Prosecution; For Remedy whereof,

Be it declared and enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That in all Cases of Convictions already had or which hereafter may be had before any Justices of the Peace, against any Person, under and by virtue of said Act, it is and shall be lawful for such Justices to tax and award Costs of the Prosecution for such Conviction agreeably to the Scale established by the Act now in Force for the Recovery of small Debts, and to issue Execution therefor together with the Damages assessed by such Justice.
